SARCI BOARD MEETINGS

SARCI Board meetings are held at the SARA House at 19:30 (7:30 pm) on the third Wednesday of January, April, July, and October.

TRAINING ACTIVITIES ARE RESTRICTED

Training activities are limited to members of that group, and others who have registered and/or been approved by the group.

SABINO CANYON PARKING

The Overflow Parking Lot near the SARA House is now frequently open for public use. Expect two-way traffic, and pedestrians. PARKING ALONG THE ROAD IS NOT APPROPRIATE, DURING CALLS OR OTHERWISE. Park at the SARA House. If you cannot open the gate to the SARA House, or the gate into Sabino during calls, call a Records or Truck person for assistance.

SARA HOUSE LANDSCAPING

Please do not remove or relocate any of the desert landscape plants or cactus for whatever reason around the SARA House property. Any removal or relocating without permission is unlawful and requires investigation of same.

AZbasicSAR TRAINING REQUIREMENT

The "Introduction to Arizona SAR" (AZbasic) class has been required by the Arizona Division of Emergency Management (ADEM). This 16-hour requirement is not new, and was added to the SARCI minimum field qualifications in 2014. Since 2013 SARA has been including AZbasic as part of Basic Training and the SALT program and Candidates have been credited with completing AZbasic, as have volunteers who completed separate AZbasic classes and provided certificates to SARCI Records.

In 2014, SARCI grandfathered volunteers who were field-qualified. ADEM has stated that every volunteer must complete the AZbasic class: the grandfathering is not acceptable. SARCI field-qualifications will not change for the immediate future. Classes will be scheduled as needed to provide opportunities for volunteers to attend AZbasic. The first class will be Sundays, Sept 10 and 17.

The "Arizona Basic Search and Rescue" manual is a 200 page document used with the AZbasic class. It can be downloaded from the Documents section at <u>http://www.saraz.org/</u>. You may print or use this document with a tablet or e-reader.

The SARA Member Advocates would like to remind all Members of the need to work with each other, discuss issues directly, and to work face to face whenever possible. The Board of Directors have many responsibilities and by working with the Member Advocates, we can take issues to the Board when necessary, but with enough information for the Board to be able to discuss it. The Board's role is intended for organizational oversight and direction and not for every operational process. Each Board member has a portfolio of responsibilities with committees to work out issues and make recommendations to the Board for discussion.

Also, remember that emails can be interpreted not as intended, but as written. Consider not "replying all" and not necessarily including the prior email chain on every email. Finally, the Board's President is the sole liaison between the PCSD and SARA. Any interaction with the PCSD must go through the President to ensure a consistent message in both directions. Please feel free to contact the SARA Advocates with any questions or concerns.

SARA TRAINING: September

Leadership and Risk Assessment training will be taking place starting at 08:00 at the SARA House on September 2^{nd} . This training is an orange card sign off but all members are encouraged to attend. This will NOT be a Death-by-Powerpoint training.

Looking ahead to October's monthly training, this will be the joint training with other counties that was postponed in July due to the Burro Fire. We expect to have quite a few Cochise County SAR volunteers and a few from Santa Cruz and Graham Counties.

The training will be on using technical rope rescue systems for patient extrication in the mountains. We will use our MPD systems, and the other counties will use their standard setup. This will be a chance to see what the other county SAR units have, in case we're called on for mutual assistance. There will also be opportunities for task book sign-offs on both the Awareness and Operations pages.

The training will be on Saturday, October 7, probably up at the Lizard Rock area. More information and a Whoozin poll will be provided sometime in September.

<u>Rescuer safety</u>: Monsoon means the dew point is up, humidity is high, and risk of heat injury is actually higher than during the hotter but dryer times of the summer. Make sure you are not only staying hydrated but being cognizant of your performance status; shedding heat is much more difficult as evaporation cooling is less effective in higher humidity. Stay safe out there.


TV Falls, Rincons

15:40 – 16:45 A woman jumping into a pool had a leg injury, downstream from the Main Trail. RMFD, PCSD, and SARA personnel packaged her for a Sheriff1 hoist and she was delivered to the road.

Sat Aug 12 <u>12</u>/ <u>48</u>/ 70ym hiker exhausted **Butterfly Trail, Catalinas MFLD** 16:20 – 18:30 A male became exhausted while hiking the Butterfly Trail, partly due to effects of medications. Teams met him at the Butterfly Peak trail junction and saddle. O₂ was provided at low flow, and he hiked to the trailhead without further problems.

Wed Aug 16 <u>14</u>/ <u>58</u>/ 3 hikers lost Sabino Basin, Catalinas Survev1 17:30 – 19:10 A group returning from Hutchs' Pool became separated, with three missing the trail at Pine Creek Crossing and continuing up East Fork beyond the junction with the Palisades Trail. They found cellphone coverage and asked for help. The rest of their group was waiting at the end of the road, except for one that hiked back up trail to assist. The lost group had no other problems, so were directed back down trail, and were met by the Hasty Team a short distance beyond the Dam Site.
