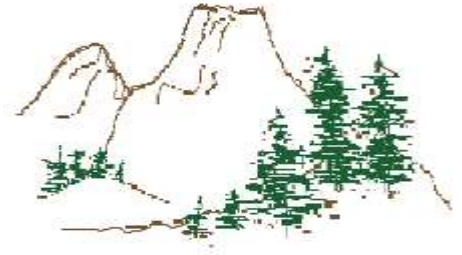

SABINO CANYON PARKING

NEW TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

This is a reminder of some training requirements that will go into effect soon:

Bloodborne Pathogens Awareness training - needs to be done annually. Check your status on the SARCI Field Qual Report (available on the SARCI Data page) in the "BBP" column. It shows the year and month (YYMM) that your training expires.

If you need this training, contact your team leadership.

AZBasicSAR – must have been done after 2012. Check your status on the SARCI Field Qual Report in the "AZ Basic" Column. If this field is shaded yellow you must take a current version of this training.

If you need this 16 hour training, advise Records of your availability so we can schedule at appropriate times.

Sometime over the next few months these will formally become SARCI Field Qualification requirements. Don't delay!

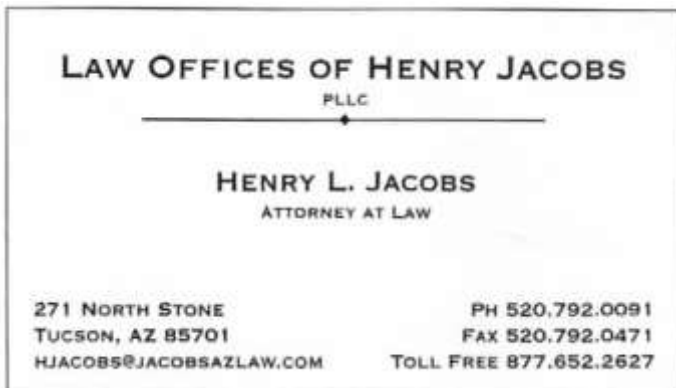

Helmets and gloves are required. Litter attendants will need a commercially-sewn seat harness, at least one short Prusik, and a couple of carabiners.

Meet at 106 no later than 0800 on Saturday, June 2.

Looking ahead, July's training will be on leadership and risk management at the SARA House on Saturday, July 7.

Mission Hrs now show total portal-to-portal times (not Rdvs). Mission times now show Field IN/OUT times (not Rdvs).

- Thu Apr 05 6/ 14/ 50yf hiker exhausted Phoneline Trail, Catalinas RMFD**
 16:30 – 17:10 A woman from Wisconsin hiked the Phoneline from Stop 9 and became dehydrated. Passers-by called for help and provided extra water. A forest volunteer accompanied her down trail until meeting Rural Fire, a SAR Officer and volunteer teams. All continued without problems, down the Link Trail to the road.
- Thu Apr 12 14/ 49/ 55yf hiker ankle injury Phoneline Trail, Catalinas RMFD**
 10:30 – 11:50 A hiker injured her ankle between the top of the switchbacks and the top of the Historic Trail. She was carried out.
- Sat Apr 14 33/ 116/ 33ym missing El Camino del Cerro, Tucson Mtns NPS**
 06:20 – 09:05 A male was reported missing. The next day his car was found at the trailhead and a limited search was completed before dark. The next morning resources were staging and planning team assignments. A canine team had started early and located the subject deceased a short distance up a drainage. A team assisted with the evacuation.
- Tue Apr 17 11/ 31/ 75ym hiker exhausted Finger Rock Trail, Catalinas RMFD**
 00:35 – 01:55 A hiker was affected by a recent change in meds, and was returning from the summit when he was unable to continue from a short distance above the spring. He was rehydrated and was then able to walk out.
- Sun May 06 12/ 12/ 28yf hiker exhausted SARA Trail, TV Canyon, Rincons RMFD**
No field times A hiker was unable to hike out of the canyon. By the time rescue teams arrived, she was able to continue to the road.
- Sun May 06 24/ 50/ 68yf hiker exhausted Phoneline Trail, Catalinas RMFD**
 12:20 – 13:50 While teams were returning from the previous call, a hiker was reported exhausted on the Phoneline Trail, who had stumbled and fell off-trail. She was carried out by stokes.
- Sun May 06 3/ 4/ 68yf hiker exhausted 7 Falls Trailhead, Catalinas**
 13:10 – 14:00 During the previous call, an exhausted hiker contacted the PSAR boot at the 7 Falls Trailhead. She rested and was provided fluids, then escorted to her vehicle at the north end of Bear Canyon Road.
- Sun May 06 19/ 25/ ??ym hiker exhausted x2, Bear Canyon Trail, Catalinas RMFD**
 14:00 – 14:20 As the Phoneline Trail call was completed, and exhausted hiker was reported at Bear Canyon, and found at crossing 2. He was rehydrated and walked to the trailhead.
- Sun May 06 13/ 43/ Trail runners exhausted Mt Lemmon Trail, Catalinas**
No field times Two runners had started at the Visitors Center and were exhausted near the top of the mountain. By the time teams drove up, they had reached vehicles.
- Sat May 26 16/ 34/ 19yf hiker exhausted x7, Bear Canyon Trail, Catalinas**
 15:20 – 17:05 An out-of-town hiker didn't take much water on her hike to 7 Falls, and called for help from near crossing 7. She was provided fluids, then walked out with teams.
