NEW TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

This is a reminder of some training requirements that will go into effect soon:

Bloodborne Pathogens Awareness training - needs to be done annually. Check your status on the SARCI Field Qual Report (available on the SARCI Data page) in the "BBP" column. It shows the year and month (YYMM) that your training expires.

If you need this training, contact your team leadership.

AZBasicSAR – must have been done after 2012. Check your status on the SARCI Field Qual Report in the "AZ Basic" Column. If this field is shaded yellow you must take a current version of this training.

If you need this 16 hour training, advise Records of your availability so we can schedule at appropriate times.

Sometime over the next few months these will formally become SARCI Field Qualification requirements. Don't delay!

SARA TRAINING:

September's training will be on land navigation; it will be held on Saturday, September 8, with rendezvous at 106 at 0730. Please note the earlier rendezvous time due to the expected heat of the day. Please bring your full rescue pack with sufficient water and snacks for four or five hours in the field. It would be good to have a GPS unit or a phone app in which you can enter and read location coordinates in several different forms (degrees/decimal minutes, decimal degrees, UTM, etc.).

Rescuers (orange shirts) are always welcome at monthly trainings to assist and to train.

There will be an additional field training for technical skills on Saturday, September 15. It will probably be held at the area around Forest Road 4403. This may be an opportunity to check out the new Stokes wheel and handles.

Rendezvous will be at 106 no later than 08:00. Please bring your full rescue pack and your harness, if you have one. Helmets and gloves are required.

We all should know that SARA is a Mountain Rescue Association (MRA) member. As such, we are required to maintain our certification. To do so, we have to periodically demonstrate our competence in rescue techniques, processes and methods.

Last winter, SARA was scheduled to perform our winter recertification. Because of the lack of snow, MRA granted us a delay to the upcoming winter. The recertification consists, as a minimum, of a snow beacon search, rescue of the victim, medical treatment and sled transport of the person. Recertification may also include an avalanche probe line and snow anchor construction.

This year is complicated by the fact that CAMRA (Phoenix SAR) was also given a bye by MRA. As a result, we are coordinating our re-certification with CAMRA. =

Coconino County Sheriff's Department Search and Rescue is coordinating the evaluators.

SARA plans to do this recertification January 19th and 20th with travel on January 18th. Saturday will have one team re-cert and the other on Sunday. Teams will return on Sunday. SARA's December 8th training class will consist of winter skills training to prepare us for the re-cert.

The location is tentatively set for Flagstaff's Snow Bowl Ski Resort. We are in the process of finding accommodations. We are evaluating Fort Tuthill's facilities. That site has a hotel, cabins and YURTS.

To successfully pass this critical exercise, SARA is need of 25 members to commit to the upcoming training and re-cert exercise. The commitment will result in fun days playing in the snow using snowshoes, crampons and snow beacons.

Each member must have adequate personal clothing and the standard rescue pack. SARA does have the bulk of needed winter gear snowshoes etc. Personal equipment capabilities are welcome. Any issues will be sorted out prior.

Contact John Bechman if you are interested. We are sending out this invite now because the holidays always are a scheduling issue for most of us.

13:50 - 15:05A group requested help for one of the party who was exhausted. They had hiked up the stream so were unsure of their location. Teams found the group between x5 and x6, provided refreshments and hiked out without problems.

A hiker was exhausted near Romero Pools. She walked down trail to Sheriff1 at the Pools LZ and was flown out. 10:45 - 14:55Teams encountered another hiker and provided assistance as they hiked downtrail. The hiker was unable to continue to the vehicles at the old trailhead, so Sheriff1 hoisted and delivered the hiker to the Park LZ.
