

The following article shares some very interesting information on how dogs use their noses:

Ever noticed those slits at the sides of a dog's nose? Why do dogs have them? Once again, nature proves her elegance in the design of our dogs. When we humans inhale and exhale, air comes in the same way it goes out. Any smells that come in through our mouths are forced out as we exhale, if we exhale out our mouths.

When a dog exhales through his nose, however, the exhaled air is released through those slits and off to the side so that nice, smelly air going into the dog's nostrils doesn't get diluted with the outgoing air. Put another way, the slits allow the dog to avoid smelling what he just exhaled.



The slits help the dog hold scent particles in the nostrils even as exhaled air passing out the slits creates a swirling air turbulence allowing interesting odors to be inhaled directly into the center of each nostril. Since dogs breathe faster when trying to sniff a certain smell, they widen their nostrils to pull in more air which makes it possible for a dog searching for smells to have a steady stream of air coming in for up to 40 seconds, maybe even longer.

The slits also allow dogs to wiggle each nostril independently which gives them the ability to know which nostril a smell entered. This is how a dog can pinpoint where a smell is coming from, and why a dog searching for smells on the ground will weave back and forth as he follows a trail.

We all know the superb smelling abilities of dogs, but let's use an analogy between scent and sight to really put it into perspective: If our eyes were our nose, what we as humans can see at 1/3 of a mile, our dog can see more than 3,000 miles away and still see as well. Just wow.

2019 WHISKEY OFF-ROAD RECAP

It was a busy year for SARA at the Whiskey Off-Road mountain bike race in Prescott. SARA cared for thirty-eight patients. As usual, there were many abrasions with a few lacerations. Surprisingly, there were no shoulder injuries. Two riders were transported by ambulance to Yavapai Regional Medical Center (YRMC). One rider with a possible cardiac issue was brought to the Medical Tent by R782. His care was transferred to Prescott Fire Department personnel, who evaluated him and transported him to YRMC. The second rider, who had a possible spinal injury, was in the backcountry, but luckily was near a checkpoint with road access. After a short stokes carry, he was transported by ambulance to YRMC. R782 transported a third rider with no available local support from the course to YRMC for treatment of a leg injury. SARA had six members present on Friday and Saturday. Seven SARA members were present on Sunday.

SARA MEDICAL TRAINING

Below are the medical trainings currently being offered by the SARA Medical Committee. These training are open to members of all SARCI component groups. Registration via Whoozin is required in advance for all classes to ensure sufficient instructors / materials. Class may be cancelled if minimum registrations are not received by one week prior. All training will be held at the SARA House.

CPR: AHA Basic Life Support for the Healthcare Professionals. A minimum of 4 participants is necessary to host the class. Participants are required to bring their own face masks / face shields. \$5 fee to cover AHA fees for issuing CPR card. Payable to the instructor via cash or check.

Blood Borne Pathogens (BBP): It is an AZ state requirement that all search and rescue volunteers take an OSHA approved BBP class once per year. There are no fees or required materials for this course. Minimum 4 students needed to host the class.

Wilderness First Aid (WFA): For those needing WFA, the following session is scheduled. Minimum 4 students needed to host the class. There are no fees or required materials for this course.

Wilderness Emergency Medical Responder (WEMR): Registration is now open for the Fall WEMR session. The course will run from Tue Sep 10, 2019 to Sat Nov 16, 2019. Classes will be on Tuesday / Thursday evenings from 18:30 - 22:00 every week with two all-day Saturday classes on October 5th and November 16th.

The cost of the class will be identical to the 2018 WEMR class at \$275 per person, with \$75 being returned to the student upon successfully passing the NREMT EMR exam. Registration fees includes the course book and course-specific materials.

This is the last WEMR session before the SARA transition from OEC to WEMR is complete. The next session will be in Fall 2020.

A minimum of 12 students is required in order to host this class. Please only register as "In" for this class if you are able to commit to all of the scheduled class dates. If you are interested but not able to fully commit at this time, please register as "Maybe". If you initially register then find you cannot attend the class, please update your Whoozin registration accordingly.
