## **OEC MEDICAL CERTIFICATION**

A representative cross section of SARA, including Board members, EMTs and other medical professionals, NR EMRs, OEC holders, and the co-chairs of the Medical Training and Standards Committee, met with Doug Crunk from the Arizona Department of Health Services on September 11, 2019 to clarify roles, responsibilities and state statutory requirements with respect to medical certifications for SARA field-active Rescuers and Candidates. The notes from this discussion and a roster of those participating were disseminated to the SARA membership on September 16 via email.

As a result of new information gleaned from the September 11 discussion, the Board of Directors is proposing an interim six-month delay in the retirement date for the OEC certification, previously enacted as a SARA policy change in early 2018. The OEC retirement date would be changed from January 1, 2020 to July 1, 2020 under this proposed new policy. This delay will afford the Medical Training and Standards Committee and the Board of Directors the opportunity to process the new information obtained from the state, evaluate our current certifications and requirements, and devise a path forward that will best meet the needs of SARA and the community while satisfying all statutory and other established requirements.

Since this proposal constitutes a change to SARA's Membership policies, the proposal will be presented for member comment at the next two SARA monthly meetings per our policies, to be followed by a Board vote on the proposed policy change.

The specific policy amendment is as follows:

#### From the SARA Policies:

  - F. Qualifications
    - 5. Outdoor Emergency Care (OEC) will be accepted as a medical training for field qualification for Candidates and Rescuers until January 1, 2020.

#### shall be amended to:

  - F. Qualifications
    - 5. Outdoor Emergency Care (OEC) will be accepted as a medical training for field qualification for Candidates and Rescuers until July 1, 2020.

In preparation for the MRA technical rope rescue recertification in October, we will have several trainings (The first of these was the monthly training for August and the second in September). The third MRA training will also be the October monthly training. Some members will be attending the bike race in Pinetop on Saturday, October 5, so the training will be held on Sunday, October 6. Meet at 106, NLT 07:30; bring your full rescue pack and your seat and chest harnesses.

The MRA recertification is on Saturday, October 19. Meet at 106, NLT 07:30, and travel to the Box Camp Trailhead. If you want to participate in this event, you must have attended one or more of the above rehearsals so that you'll be able to fit in where needed.

#### **SARA MEDICAL TRAINING**

Below are the medical training currently being offered by the SARA Medical Committee. These training are open to members of all SARCI component groups plus the Caver SME's. Advanced registration via Whoozin is required for all classes to ensure sufficient instructors / materials. If sufficient registrations are not received by one week prior to the class, the class may be cancelled. All training will be held at the SARA House.

**Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR):** AHA Basic Life Support for the Healthcare Professionals with QCPR Biofeedback Manikins. A minimum of 4 participants is necessary to host the class. Participants are required to bring their own face masks / face shields. \$5 fee to cover AHA fees for issuing CPR card. Payment by check only, made out to Southern Arizona Rescue Association.

**Wilderness First Aid (WFA):** For those needing WFA, the following sessions are scheduled. Minimum 4 students needed to host the class. There are no fees or required materials for this course. Weekday sessions will be held from 18:00 - 22:00 and Weekend sessions from 08:00 - 17:00.

**Blood Borne Pathogens (BBP):** It is an AZ state requirement that all search and rescue volunteers take an OSHA BBP class once per year. Eventually members will be able to take this online on the SARA website, but until this system is available we will continue offering in-person classes.

**Nalaxone Administration:** Due to the nation-wide opioid crisis, the State of Arizona recommends all first responders be trained in the administration of Naloxone. SARA offers this optional training to all SARCI members free of charge. To remain current it is recommended rescuers re-take this training once every two years.

**Wilderness Emergency Medical Responder (WEMR):** Preliminary dates for the Fall 2020 WEMR class are from August 11, 2020 to October 17, 2020. Classes will be on Tuesday / Thursday evenings from 18:00 - 22:00 every week with two all-day Saturday classes (dates TBD). Registration will be open once the dates are finalized.

The cost of the class will be identical to the 2019 WEMR class at \$275 per person, with \$75 being returned to the student upon successfully passing the NREMT EMR exam. Registration fees include the course book and course specific materials.

SARA will provide medical support for the 2019 Tour of the White Mountains (TOWM) mountain bike event. This year's ToWM will be held Sat, October 5, in Pinetop-Lakeside. This is a one-day event with most people returning to Tucson after dinner on Saturday.

To participate, you must be a fully field-qualified member of SARA at the time of the event. This includes both current medical (WFR +Blue Card, WFR-Pro, OEC, EMT) and field-skills certifications. Qualified candidates are welcome.

No one need pay for their housing, unless they wish separate accommodations. Epic Rides will provide two rooms for Friday night. The rooms will be shared occupancy.

The Board has authorized the sale of some of our retired hardware. There are two models of locking carabiners (\$3 each), several Rescucenders (\$10 each), a few rappel racks (\$20 each), and a very few pulleys (\$3 each). In order to give everyone an opportunity to buy this gear, there will be a limit of five carabiners per Member for the time being, and no more than two Rescucenders per Member.

In addition, we've recently changed out all of our nylon 1" tubular webbing, and we have hundreds of feet available for free.

IMPORTANT: All of the hardware and webbing has been previously used and may not be suitable for life safety applications. If you purchase any of the hardware or take any of the webbing, you will be using it at your own risk.
