DPS "Screamer Suit" REPLACED

by Mykle Raymond, Mykle.Raymond @ sarci.org DPS Air Rescue has replaced the Bauman "Screamer Suit" with the AVED "A-ved", Ambulatory Victim Extrication Device from Priority 1 Air Rescue (https://prioritylairrescue.net). The Screamer and AVED are very similar. Yates and CMC Pro offer similar devices, with very different prices. All of them are rated for up to 400 lb loads. Ms.Bauman has retired, so has the Screamer.

The AVED uses a Cobra quick-release buckle on the waist strap, rather than a plastic buckle. The middle strap (between the legs) is adjustable. Wearing and connecting the AVED to the short-haul line is very similar, but will normally use two carabiners.

SARA TRAINING

by Dale Mann, dale.mann @ sarci.org The monthly training for November will be on search planning and management. It will be held at the SARA House on Saturday, November 2, starting at 09:00. SARA's Incident Management Team (IMT) will lead the training, and it will include route and location searches, area searches, and the use of mapping tools to aid in search segmentation. This is an opportunity to see the skills that go into the planning of more extensive searches.

Looking ahead, the training for December will be the annual truck and equipment inventory and inspection. All three of the trucks will be at the SARA House for the exercise. The training for January 2020 will be on tracking. More information will follow.

On October 18, the Incident Management Team (IMT) successfully completed the MRA search management recertification, using as an example the Smallwood search in the Santa Rita Mountains. On October 19, a team passed the MRA technical rope rescue recertification by performing a vertical rescue of an injured person from below a cliff on the Box Camp trail. As a bonus, when this team was returning to Tucson, it assisted Mount Lemmon Fire and PCSD in rescuing a woman who had fallen in one of the rock formations near milepost 15.

Congratulations and thanks to all of the members of both teams in maintaining our good standing with the MRA.

SARA MEDICAL TRAINING

Below are the medical training currently being offered by the SARA Medical Committee. These training are open to members of all SARCI component groups plus the Caver SME's. Advanced registration via Whoozin is required for all classes to ensure sufficient instructors / materials. If sufficient registrations are not received by one week prior to the class, the class may be cancelled. All training will be held at the SARA House.

Blood Borne Pathogens (BBP): It is an AZ state requirement that all search and rescue volunteers take an OSHA BBP class once per year. Eventually members will be able to take this online on the SARA website, but until this system is available we will continue offering in-person classes.

December 02 (Mon, 18:30 - 20:30): (BBP and Nalaxone)

Nalaxone Administration: Due to the nation-wide opioid crisis, the State of Arizona recommends all first responders be trained in the administration of Naloxone. SARA offers this optional training to all SARCI members free of charge. To remain current it is recommended rescuers re-take this training once every two years.

Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR): AHA Basic Life Support for Healthcare Professionals with QCPR Biofeedback Manikins. A minimum of 4 participants is necessary to host the class. Participants are required to bring their own face masks / face shields. \$5 fee to cover AHA fees for issuing CPR card. Payment by check only, made out to Southern Arizona Rescue Association.

There are currently no CPR classes scheduled.

Wilderness First Aid (WFA): For those needing WFA, the following sessions are scheduled. Minimum 4 students needed to host the class. There are no fees or required materials for this course. Weekday sessions will be held from 18:00 - 22:00 and Weekend sessions from 08:00 - 17:00.

Wilderness Emergency Medical Responder (WEMR): Dates for the upcoming WEMR class are TBD but will not occur until after the Spring SALT class. Classes will be on Tuesday / Thursday evenings from 18:00 - 22:00 every week with two all-day Saturday classes (dates TBD). Registration will be open once the dates are finalized.

The cost of the class will be identical to the 2019 WEMR class at \$275 per person, with \$75 being returned to the student upon successfully passing the NREMT EMR exam. Registration fees include the course book and course specific materials.

Description: This course is designed to prepare individuals who may be directly affected by a disaster help themselves, their family and other community members. Participants will learn how to develop a family preparedness plan, practice self-rescue, perform search and light rescue techniques, and understand the recovery process.

Target Audience: Church Groups, Volunteer Fire Departments, CERT, Youth Groups, NGO, Volunteer agencies.

Registration: This course requires self-registration through the State's online registration system at <u>dematraining.az.gov</u>. It is recommended that participants enroll no later than 14 days prior to the start of the course using the above *Event ID or Course Name*. ** This course has been deemed eligible for AZPOST continuing education credits **

Description: When disaster strikes, it can be a challenge to effectively mobilize, organize, and deploy resources needed to perform wide area searches. This course is an excellent training opportunity for any jurisdiction or agency that may face such an emergency. The course content applies to a vast number of critical situations, including natural disasters or terrorist incidents.

You will be instructed in practical search methods and skills so you can perform systematic searches over a large affected area. The training will include challenging exercises that mirror real life scenarios. The three-day long event will conclude with an in-depth exercise that requires participants to utilize the skills gained during the course by working through an incident from start to finish in a single operational period.

The trainers delivering the course are knowledgeable—they are experienced emergency responders who have actively utilized wide area search techniques during some of the nation's largest and most challenging operations, such as Hurricanes Katrina, Ike, Gustav, and Rita; the Space Shuttle Columbia recovery operation; and many other incidents that required the same comprehensive strategies.

Target Audience: Fire, LE, Emergency Management, HazMat Responders, Military, Medical Professionals, NGOs, Volunteer Responders, organizations with search responsibilities.

Registration: This course requires self-registration through the State's online registration system at <u>dematraining.az.gov</u>. It is recommended that participants enroll no later than 14 days prior to the start of the course using the above *Event ID or Course Name*. First time users will be required to create an account prior to enrollment. *You must provide a valid email address and phone number for contact information*. Instructions are included on page 2 of this bulletin.

Registration Instructions

1. To register for an event, visit <u>dematraining.az.gov</u>. This is a self-enrollment system. Participants must have their own account and self-enroll for training.

2. To create a new account

- **a.** Click on the "WebForms" link under the resources section on the right side of the page.
- **b.** Click "Request DEMA Training Portal Account", complete the form and click submit. Your request will be reviewed within one business day. Once your account is approved, you will receive a welcome email with instructions for completing the setup process and accessing your account.

3. If you have an existing Acadis Portal Account

- **a.** Log in with your email address and password.
- **b.** If you have forgotten your password, clink on the "Reset your password" link under the password field. You will need to enter the email address associated with your account. If you have forgotten your login email address, please contact us at 602-464-6225 or <u>training@azdema.gov</u> for assistance.

4. Search for an event

- **a.** Once logged in, click on or hover over "Training & Events" (top navigation pane) and click "Browse or Sign up for Training".
- **b.** You will see a list of all currently available training events.
- **c.** Using the "Filters" button toward the top right of the screen, you may search by keyword, course number or other criteria.
- **d.** To the right of each course there will be a button to register or join the waitlist (if the class is full).
- **e.** Be sure to view and note the training event details by clicking on the event name.

5. Two ways to register

- **a.** From the Training Event Details screen click on "Request Enrollment" on the bottom right. You will be brought to a screen that will confirm the event name and your contact information. To enroll, click "Submit Request" on the bottom right corner.
- **b.** From the List of Available Training screen, click the link that says, "Register" on the right side of the event. You will be brought to a screen that will confirm the event name and your contact information. To enroll, click "Submit Request" on the bottom right corner.
- **c.** If the class has mandatory prerequisites, you will be asked to provide documentation to fulfill the requirement. Once complete, click "Submit Request".

6. To cancel your training event registration

- **a.** Log in to your account and click "Registration" (top navigation pane). All requested training will be listed.
- **b.** For training events that you have a "Pending" status for, click "Cancel Request" next to the event you wish to cancel. You'll be asked to confirm your cancellation, and then will receive an email confirmation of your cancellation.
- c. Training events that you have an "Enrolled" status for cannot be self-cancelled. Please call 602-464-6225 or email <u>training@azdema.gov</u> to cancel.


