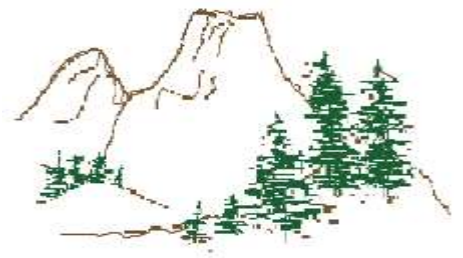

DPS "Screamer Suit" REPLACED

DPS Air Rescue has replaced the Bauman "Screamer Suit" with the AVED "A-ved", Ambulatory Victim Extrication Device from Priority 1 Air Rescue (<https://priority1airrescue.net>). The Screamer and AVED are very similar. Yates and CMC Pro offer similar devices, with very different prices. All of them are rated for up to 400 lb loads. Ms.Bauman has retired, so has the Screamer.

The AVED uses a Cobra quick-release buckle on the waist strap, rather than a plastic buckle. The middle strap (between the legs) is adjustable. Wearing and connecting the AVED to the short-haul line is very similar, but will normally use two carabiners.

SARA MEDICAL TRAINING

Below are the medical training courses currently being offered by the SARA Medical Committee. These training are open to members of all SARCI component groups plus the Caver SMEs. Advanced registration via Whoozin is required for all classes to ensure sufficient instructors / materials. If sufficient registrations are not received by one week prior to the class, it may be subject to cancellation. All training will be held at the SARA House.

Note: The BBP and Nalaxone courses listed below occur on the same night

Blood Borne Pathogens (BBP): It is an AZ state requirement that all search and rescue volunteers take an OSHA BBP class once per year. Eventually members will be able to take this online on the SARA website, but until this system is available we will continue offering in-person classes.

Nalaxone Administration: Due to the nation-wide opioid crisis, the State of Arizona recommends all first responders be trained in the administration of Naloxone. SARA offers this optional training to all SARCI members free of charge. To remain current it is recommended rescuers re-take this training once every two years.

Wilderness First Aid (WFA): For those needing WFA, the following sessions are scheduled. Minimum 4 students needed to host the class. There are no fees or required materials for this course. Weekday sessions will be held from 18:00 - 22:00 and Weekend sessions from 08:00 - 17:00.

Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR): AHA Basic Life Support for Healthcare Professionals with QCPR Biofeedback Manikins. A minimum of 4 participants are necessary to host the class. Participants are required to bring their own face masks / face shields. \$5 fee to cover AHA fees for issuing CPR card. Payment by check only, made out to Southern Arizona Rescue Association.

Wilderness Emergency Medical Responder (WEMR) Dates for the upcoming WEMR class are TBD but will not occur until after the Spring SALT class. Classes will be on Tuesday/Thursday evenings from 18:00 - 22:00 every week with two all-day Saturday classes (dates TBD). Registration will be open once the dates are finalized. The cost of the class will be identical to the 2019 WEMR class at \$275 per person, with \$75 being returned to the student upon successfully passing the NREMT EMR exam. Registration fees includes the course book and course specific materials.

Description: This course is designed to prepare individuals who may be directly affected by a disaster help themselves, their family and other community members. Participants will learn how to develop a family preparedness plan, practice self-rescue, perform search and light rescue techniques, and understand the recovery process.

Target Audience: Church Groups, Volunteer Fire Departments, CERT, Youth Groups, NGO, Volunteer agencies.

Registration: This course requires self-registration through the State's online registration system at dematraining.az.gov. It is recommended that participants enroll no later than 14 days prior to the start of the course using the above *Event ID or Course Name*. Description: When disaster strikes, it can be a challenge to effectively mobilize, organize, and deploy resources needed to perform wide area searches. This course is an excellent training opportunity for any jurisdiction or agency that may face such an emergency. The course content applies to a vast number of critical situations, including natural disasters or terrorist incidents.

You will be instructed in practical search methods and skills so you can perform systematic searches over a large affected area. The training will include challenging exercises that mirror real life scenarios. The three-day long event will conclude with an in-depth exercise that requires participants to utilize the skills gained during the course by working through an incident from start to finish in a single operational period.

The trainers delivering the course are knowledgeable—they are experienced emergency responders who have actively utilized wide area search techniques during some of the nation's largest and most challenging operations, such as Hurricanes Katrina, Ike, Gustav, and Rita; the Space Shuttle Columbia recovery operation; and many other incidents that required the same comprehensive strategies.

Target Audience: Fire, LE, Emergency Management, HazMat Responders, Military, Medical Professionals, NGOs, Volunteer Responders, organizations with search responsibilities.

Registration: This course requires self-registration through the State's online registration system at dematraining.az.gov. It is recommended that participants enroll no later than 14 days prior to the start of the course using the above *Event ID or Course Name*. First time users will be required to create an account prior to enrollment. *You must provide a valid email address and phone number for contact information.* Instructions are included on page 2 of this bulletin.

Registration Instructions

1. **To register for an event**, visit dematrainingsystem.azurewebsites.net/. This is a self-enrollment system. Participants must have their own account and self-enroll for training.
2. **To create a new account**
 - a. Click on the “WebForms” link under the resources section on the right side of the page.
 - b. Click “Request DEMA Training Portal Account”, complete the form and click submit. Your request will be reviewed within one business day. Once your account is approved, you will receive a welcome email with instructions for completing the setup process and accessing your account.
3. **If you have an existing Acadis Portal Account**
 - a. Log in with your email address and password.
 - b. If you have forgotten your password, click on the “Reset your password” link under the password field. You will need to enter the email address associated with your account. If you have forgotten your login email address, please contact us at 602-464-6225 or training@azdema.gov for assistance.
4. **Search for an event**
 - a. Once logged in, click on or hover over “Training & Events” (top navigation pane) and click “Browse or Sign up for Training”.
 - b. You will see a list of all currently available training events.
 - c. Using the “Filters” button toward the top right of the screen, you may search by keyword, course number or other criteria.
 - d. To the right of each course there will be a button to register or join the waitlist (if the class is full).
 - e. Be sure to view and note the training event details by clicking on the event name.
5. **Two ways to register**
 - a. From the Training Event Details screen click on “Request Enrollment” on the bottom right. You will be brought to a screen that will confirm the event name and your contact information. To enroll, click “Submit Request” on the bottom right corner.
 - b. From the List of Available Training screen, click the link that says, “Register” on the right side of the event. You will be brought to a screen that will confirm the event name and your contact information. To enroll, click “Submit Request” on the bottom right corner.
 - c. If the class has mandatory prerequisites, you will be asked to provide documentation to fulfill the requirement. Once complete, click “Submit Request”.
6. **To cancel your training event registration**
 - a. Log in to your account and click “Registration” (top navigation pane). All requested training will be listed.
 - b. For training events that you have a “Pending” status for, click “Cancel Request” next to the event you wish to cancel. You’ll be asked to confirm your cancellation, and then will receive an email confirmation of your cancellation.

Sat Oct 19 17/ 36/ ?/yf fall injury **MP15.5 Catalina Hwy, Catalinas** **MLFD**
 12:40 – 13:25 A person fell about 15'. Teams were returning from the MRA Recert and arrived quickly. She was carried to the road.

Mon Oct 21 16/ 44/ 60yf hiker ankle injury **Above Stop 9, Sabino Canyon, Catalinas** **Sheriff1 RMFD**
 17:45 – 18:35 A hiker was off-trail below the Phoneline when she injured her ankle. Ground teams were ready to carry her down. Sheriff1 hoisted her to the Overlook LZ.

Fri Oct 25 16/ 81/ Two climbers stranded **The Fortress, Catalinas**
 18:55 – 20:00 A multi-pitch climb on The Fortress (west of Rappel Rock and Lemmon Rock Lookout) was taking longer than anticipated, and bailing down appeared challenging as the sun was setting. By the time teams got up the mountain and headed for the top of the climb, the climbers figured out how to get down (leaving lots of gear behind) and joined the teams for the hike up to the road.

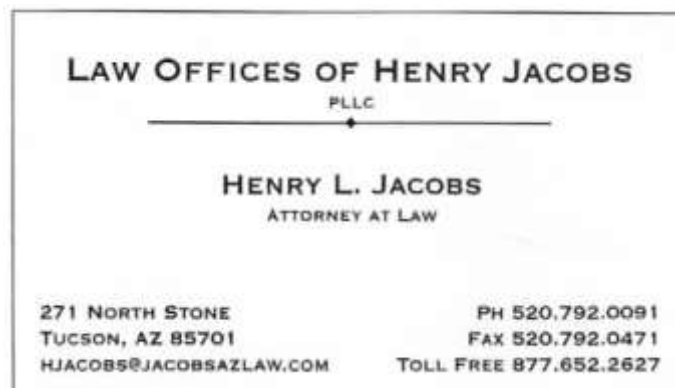
Sat Nov 16 16/ 50/ 35ym climber fall **Void of Form, Pontatoc Ridge, Catalinas** **Sheriff1 RMFD**
 16:00 – 17:05 A climber fell on a 10-pitch climb, and his belayer was unable to arrest the fall. A SAR Officer was hoisted to a slope near the climber. He was ambulatory and able to relocate to a good point for hoist, and transferred to an ambulance at SARA House.

Sun Nov 17 11/ 49/ K9 Rescue **Blackett's Ridge, Catalinas** **Sheriff1**
 12:40 – 16:00 Hikers reported a canine past the end of the trail at the top of Blackett's Ridge. He did not appear to be attached to any hiker. Sheriff1 looked around the area for anyone that may have been stranded or injured. A SAR Officer and SARA volunteer were dropped off, secured the canine and moved him onto the trail. He was able to move, so the group hiked down to meet the team coming up. Booties were put on the dog to ease his worn paws and all hiked out. The canine was scanned for a chip, and the data was used to contact the owner. They had gone to Phoenix to watch a game, and the dog escaped the dog sitter, and wound up on Blackett's Ridge.

 No field times A hiker fell and injured her head. Fire personnel were training nearby, so there were plenty of people to assist the hiker, and she was not far up trail.
