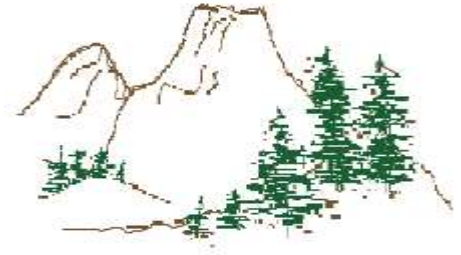

SABINO CANYON PARKING

DPS “Screamer Suit” REPLACED

DPS Air Rescue has replaced the Bauman “Screamer Suit” with the AVED “A-ved”, Ambulatory Victim Extrication Device from Priority 1 Air Rescue (<https://priority1airrescue.net>). The Screamer and AVED are very similar. Yates and CMC Pro offer similar devices, with very different prices. All of them are rated for up to 400 lb loads. Ms.Bauman has retired, so has the Screamer.

The AVED uses a Cobra quick-release buckle on the waist strap, rather than a plastic buckle. The middle strap (between the legs) is adjustable. Wearing and connecting the AVED to the short-haul line is very similar, but will normally use two carabiners.

COVID-19 MITIGATIONS

In order to help mitigate the spread of COVID-19, the Board directs that SARA suspend all in-person activities not related to missions (trainings, meetings, etc.) until 05/15/2020. Exceptions will be subject to Board approval.

Due to the potential impact of this directive on re-certification opportunities, SARA will freeze field qualification (FQ) status through June 30. During this time, a field qualified member with an expiring FQ-required certification will remain eligible for deployment in the field, upon approval by the mission IC, but will need to address any expired certs by June 30.

The Board will continue to monitor developments, and this directive may change as conditions warrant.

SARA MEDICAL DISCUSSION

As you know, the Medical Committee and many members of our organization have been working diligently to ensure that all OEC medical certified Rescuers will be able to bridge to the EMR medical certification as required by the Pima County Sheriff's Department. Effective March 19, 2020, this recommendation has been accepted by a vote of the Board of Directors.

While this original bridge course applies to the majority of our members, please know that we will work with whoever needs it to get this accepted certification to be retained within the group. All of our members are important to this organization, and we do not want to lose any one of you during this transition.

There are still some questions within the transition process yet to be answered, but these are being worked on for an acceptable resolution to our members. Speaking on behalf of the Board, I want to thank the Medical Committee and other members who have dedicated a considerable amount of time and hard work to ensure that we meet these new standards.

Also during the March 19 Board of Director's meeting, Dr. Nicola Baker was voted in as the new SARA Medical Director. Dr. Baker is a previous SARA member, and currently works as an Emergency Physician and Assistant Professor at Banner University of Arizona Medical Center. She is an avid outdoorswoman, and a Fellow of the Academy of Wilderness Medicine through the Wilderness Medical Society. Dr. Baker will be introducing herself to us, however due to the current COVID-19 pandemic, the introduction will be made via email.

In her role as SARA Medical Director, Dr. Baker will work with Dr. Kastre, who is going to remain with the PCSD SAR Unit. As with all medical providers during this time, some of whom are our own SARA members, they are confronted with an increasingly strained healthcare system. We want to express our greatest appreciation for their efforts as they fight for the health and safety our community on the "front lines."

SARA BOARD – POLICY CHANGE

After much discussion and deliberation, and many meetings, the SARA Board of Directors has accepted the recommendation of the Medical Training and Standards Committee and approved the membership policy change indicated below as it pertains to medical qualifications for field-qualified Rescuers, namely, requirement of the Wilderness EMR certification or higher for field-qualified Rescuers. This decision has been endorsed by and enjoys the full support of PCSD and our Medical Director, and was not arrived at lightly by the Board. The Board acknowledges the significant operational value that the OEC certification and curriculum have contributed to SARA over many years. Nevertheless, we believe that the WEMR certification will best serve SARA for the long term.

To summarize the changes, effective July 1, 2020 (extended by PCSD to 31 December, 2020):

- WFA will no longer be the minimum medical training required for Rescuer.
- Wilderness EMR will be the minimum medical training required for Rescuer, to include completion of the EMR course (with a wilderness component) taught by SARA and passage of the National Registry EMR exam.
- Those currently holding the Outdoor Emergency Care certification will be offered a 24-hour bridge course to prepare for the NREMR exam and transition to WEMR. There will be several opportunities to participate in this course before July 2020.
- After attainment of the WEMR certification, Rescuers will be required to recertify through the National Registry every two years through the completion of 16 hours of continuing education credits (the national standard), to include an 8-hour wilderness refresher taught by SARA.

Scope of practice will remain unchanged for OECs, in that SARA WEMRs operate within the national scope of practice as defined for EMRs, plus additional protocols approved by our Medical Director.

Please let me or the MTSC chairs know if you have any questions. Although this has at times been a contentious issue, I believe we as an organization can work through this transitional period successfully.

iii. Or an equivalent medical certification, as approved by the MTSC.

c. SARA Supplemental Medical Training Card (Blue Card).

5. Outdoor Emergency Care (OEC) will be accepted as a medical training for field qualification for Candidates and Rescuers until July 1, 2020.

SARA MEDICAL TRAINING

Below are the medical training currently being offered by the SARA Medical Committee. These training are open to members of all SARCI component groups plus the Caver SMEs. Advanced registration via Whoozin is required for all classes to ensure sufficient instructors / materials. If sufficient registrations are not received by one week prior to the class, it may be subject to cancellation. All training will be held at the SARA House. Medical Training offerings will be limited during the Spring due to SALT / WEMR / OEC transition. (... and since You-Know-Who has returned, classes will not be offered – ed.)

Wilderness First Aid (WFA): For those needing WFA, the following sessions are scheduled. Minimum 4 students needed to host the class. There are no fees or required materials for this course. Weekday sessions will be held from 18:00 - 22:00 and Weekend sessions from 08:00 - 17:00.

No WFA classes are currently scheduled

Blood Borne Pathogens (BBP): It is an AZ state requirement that all search and rescue volunteers take an OSHA BBP class once per year. Eventually members will be able to take this online on the SARA website, but until this system is available we will continue offering in-person classes.

No BBP classes are currently scheduled

Naloxone Administration: Due to the nation-wide opioid crisis, the State of Arizona recommends all first responders be trained in the administration of Naloxone. SARA offers this optional training to all SARCI members free of charge. To remain current it is recommended rescuers re-take this training once every two years.

No Naloxone classes are currently scheduled

Wilderness Emergency Medical Responder (WEMR): Dates for the upcoming WEMR class are TBD. Classes will be on Tuesday / Thursday evenings from 18:00-22:00 every week with three all-day Saturday classes. Registration will be open once the dates are finalized.

VENTANA CANYON RESCUE FEEDBACK

Well, Thursday was a different deal. It no doubt didn't help to hike on a day with lots of water flowing in the creeks. My husband is a tough guy, yes he's 69, but in excellent shape. Except for what we thought was a healed bulging disc in his spine. Perhaps that one creek boulder was just a bit too tall to easily get over. Anyway, after going over it he was in bad shape. He could not walk out. Not what we expected to happen on this beautiful Tucson day!

Thank you! The help my husband received from your group was just amazing. Calm, well trained, friendly people made the experience interesting and safe, and not nearly as awful as anticipated.

The sheriffs and firefighters were awesome too, but I don't know how to contact them, and besides you are the true angels and you're volunteers! The service you provide is indeed exceptional.

Thankfully my husband is doing much better now.

- Sun Mar 01** 10/ 11/ 62yf fall injury **Sabino Dam, Catalinas** **RMFD**
No field times A female fell at Sabino Dam. She was met by Rural Fire near the road and walked out.
- Sat Mar 14** 15/ 22/ 22yf hiker ill **Bear Canyon, Catalinas** **RMFD**
 15:00 – 15:20 A hiker was assisted from X1 to the trailhead by a Fire team.
- Sat Mar 14** 19/ 224/ 4 USAF hikers lost **Sabino Canyon, Catalinas** **Survey2 Sheriff1**
 20:35 – 10:15 Five hikers went down the Lemmon Trail and were coming back through the Wilderness of Rocks Trail. They strayed down Sabino, while the one with the map found his way out. When the four lost hikers called for help, they were well down Sabino, but still above the waterfalls and Wilderness Fork. Teams went down the Box Camp Trail and out the ridge towards Brinkley Point, then one team remained on the ridge while two teams dropped into Sabino and up the other side to the elevation of the hikers, then traversed downstream to their location. In the morning Sheriff1 ferried the hikers and teams to the Overlook LZ while the ridge team hiked out.
- Sun Mar 15** 5/ 36/ 23ym hiker without light **Douglas Spring Trail, Rincons** **TucsonRanger**
 00:50 – 05:30 A hiker returning from Mica Mtn broke his flashlight and was unable to continue. Ranger dropped two teams near Douglas Spring Camp, and they soon made voice contact. The hiker was retrieved from on trail above the camp, then all hiked out.
- Tue Mar 17** 10/ 45/ 52yf hiker ankle injury **Palisades Trail, Catalinas** **Ranger54 RMFD MLFD**
 15:10 – 17:30 A couple was hiking down Palisades Trail towards one of their vehicles at Prison Camp. One of the hikers injured her ankle and was unable to bear weight. A hasty team made it to Pine Creek Crossing while Phoenix Ranger responded, determined that they could hover at a nearby point, reconfigured at the Overlook LZ and picked up an additional rescuer, then retrieved the injured hiker and remaining people.
- Thu Mar 19** 14/ 76/ 69ym hiker back injury **Ventana Trail, Catalinas** **Omaha358**
 11:20 – 15:40 A hiker aggravated a spinal injury while stepping awkwardly across rocks at a crossing below the switchbacks. He was unable to lie down. The usual helicopters were not available, so a Customs Blackhawk responded and retrieved the hiker by hoist.
- Fri Mar 20** 13/ 41/ ??ym hiker fall injury **Pontatoc Ridge, Catalinas** **Sheriff1**
 11:05 – 12:30 A hiker climbed Pontatoc Ridge on a social trail from the north end of Swan. While playing around on rock near the usual trail, a brushy hand-hold gave way and he fell and slid about 20' down and injured an ankle. Sheriff1 hoisted him.
- Sat Mar 21** 19/ 45/ ??ym hiker ankle injury **SARA Trail, TV Canyon, Rincons** **RMFD**
 13:20 – 14:20 A heavyweight hiker injured an ankle low on the SARA Trail. Teams carried him up to the road, while others unraveled the gridlocked traffic on the road.
- Sat Mar 21** 15/ 30/ ??yf hiker frozen feet **Marshall Gulch Trail, Catalinas** **MLFD**
No field times A hiker was unable to continue down the Marshall Gulch Trail because of shoes that were not suitable for the snow. The group continued and got out while teams were driving up the mountain.
