BOARD OF DIRECTORS – COVID-19 DIRECTIVES – June 17, 2021

On March 20th 2020 the board directed that SARA suspend all activities except missions. And on May 15th 2020 the board continued the suspension of indoor activities not related to missions. Although vaccinations are now widely available COVID-19 still presents a substantial risk and the consequences of infection can be devastating. The need to avoid exposure of rescue personnel and equipment to COVID-19 remains a concern.

The Board directs that all indoor SARA activities be conducted in accordance with Southern Arizona Rescue Assn **Indoor Training Safety Guidelines dated 06/28/2021** (*included below*), as may be updated and published by MTSC (Medical Training and Standards Committee) from time to time. Indoor activities within the SARA facility involving more than fifteen (15) individuals and not related to missions (trainings, meetings, etc.) continue to be suspended until further notice. Outdoor training and activities may continue with a careful adherence to CDC guidelines for mitigating the spread of COVID-19.

We as an organization must protect our members (teammates), our equipment, the public we serve and all those we contact. The Board expects all participants in any organized SARA activity to use a mask where appropriate, adhere to social distancing recommendations, frequently disinfect equipment, and frequently wash/sanitize hands. Unvaccinated individuals are expected to wear a mask where social distancing cannot be maintained. No member may attend any SARA activity if they have any symptoms of COVID-19. This can include fever, chills, cough, shortness of breath, sore throat, headache, body aches, or loss of taste or smell. If a member develops any symptoms, he or she may not return to training or calls until at least 10 days after the onset of symptoms AND at least 3 days (72 hrs.) without fever (without the use of fever-reducing medications) and an overall reduction in symptom severity.

The Board will continue to monitor developments and review this directive at least monthly. Exceptions to this policy will be subject to MTSC approval.

RESPONSES DURING COVID TIMES

During this time of COVID-19 and social distancing, there is a modification to the standard response to a request for a mission. While typically when a request for a mission is put out, we allow all members who respond to attend the mission, some items will change now that we are in COVID time.

For missions that do not require a large number of responders, the deputy requesting the alert will work with the SARA member putting out the page to come to a number that is reasonable for the mission. For example the search at Pima Canyon the other night would probably been limited to 3 field people and an Ops vehicle. It is understood that not all missions have the required info up front to determine the number of responders needed.

In the case where additional resources are needed, a page requesting additional assistance will be put out. If the request is for 3 people, the desire is not to have the first 3 people that respond, but that the responses be the first 3 that are in close location to the rendezvous.

If no number is specified in the alert, it is assumed to be a normal call for any available resources.

Before responding, you can check the list of responders to see how many people have already responded.

SET FOR REAL anchoring training

July's training focuses on the process of arriving on a scene and setting up technical systems using the acronym **SET FOR REAL** as a tool to set up safely, efficiently, and effectively.

SET FOR REAL stands for:

- Scene (size-up and safety)
- Edge (evaluation, line of fall/patient access, natural or artificial high help)
- Terrain (anchors, other aspects of the area)
- Formulate a plan
- Orient the team to the plan
- **R**oles and responsibilities (assign and delegate)
- **R**ig it!
- Evaluate the rigging
- Accept/Adjust/Abandon
- Life Safety Check

Using this tool smoothes the process of setting up a technical rope rescue scene. Participants at all levels of technical ability are welcome to this training, which will feature aspects of teamwork and team management, technical rigging, and scene evaluation. There may be opportunities for sign-offs available.

Please bring your full rescue pack, helmet, gloves, and personal technical gear, particularly a seat harness. If we decide to do any lower/haul evolutions we will put a rescuer on the ropes. Please bring plenty of water, snacks and sun protection as we'll be mostly in the sun all day and I don't want any hangry rescuers.

Meet Tanque Verde and Catalina Hwy at 08:00 Saturday July 10. We will be at the Windy Point area for the day.

It is likely that masks will NOT be required; the training is outdoors. However, if you are uncomfortable with no masks, please let me know individually and I can make the announcement for the group. This training will take place so long as current CDC, county, city, and SARA policies are able to be followed.

The next recruiting period will start with informational orientations this summer. It is mandatory to attend one of these to gather information, ask questions, and submit an application.

Orientation I - Tuesday June 15, 2021 @ 19:00

Newly selected candidates from the applications we receive must complete SARA basic search and rescue training, as well as medical/first aid training in order to be field qualified. Candidates that are selected must attend field training which will be conducted August-November followed by medical/first aid classes in the winter. A schedule will be provided to those that attend one of these two orientations.

OEC CORNER

The upcoming 2021 OEC Cycle B Refreshers will be held on Saturday, July 17th and Sunday, August 15th. The refreshers will start at 08:00, please be there no later than 07:45 to check in.

The hybrid format will be used, which includes completing the Cycle B workbook, on-line course, and the in-person skills portion. Remember that we will be including the skills that would have been refreshed during the 2020 Cycle A Refresher. This will primarily be a day of practicing your skills.

You should have recently received an email from National Ski Patrol letting you know that they will not be sending out the workbook this year and that you will need to download and print it yourself.

All of this year's refresher will be based on the Sixth Edition of Outdoor Emergency Care Book, which was published in May 2020. Be sure that you have this edition, as there have been several changes.

In order to attend one of the Refreshers, you will need to do the following:

1. Log in to your NSP account and register for one of the following courses:

F801210001 - July 17 or

F029210003 - August 15

Click on **Course Schedule**, scroll down to **Course Number equals** and put in the number for the refresher you an on attending. Click **Find** and then on **OEC Refresher B**. Follow the instruction.

2. Download the 2021 OEC Cycle B Refresher Workbook and answer sheet.

Click on **Programs** and then **OEC**. Scroll down to **OEC Refresher Workbooks and Forms**. Print the 2021 OEC Cycle B Refresher Workbook and answer sheet. Be sure to complete the workbook and answer sheet. *Note: This is available now.*

3. Complete the 2021 OEC Cycle B Online Module

Click on Member Resources, Online Learning, Click Here to Enter the Online Learning Management System, and Courses. Scroll down to the 2021 OEC Refresher B – Online Module. *Note: According to NSP, this will be online by July 1st.*

Logistics are still being worked out, however at this time, masks will be required and you may need to be outside for a portion of the skills.

On the day of the refresher, you will need to bring the following items:

- 1. A face mask
- 2. Your Sixth Edition OEC Book
- 3. Your completed 2021 Cycle B Refresher workbook with a copy of your answer sheet to be turned in at registration. It would be a good idea to bring your 2020 Cycle A Refresher workbook to use as a reference as well.
- 4. A copy of your Certificate of Completion for the 2021 On-line refresher to be turned in at registration.
- 5. Your OEC Technician Card
- 6. Your current CPR Card
- 7. Water/drinks and snacks. There will not be any snack sharing this year and the kitchen area will be closed.
- 8. Wear comfortable clothing and shoes for being inside and outside.
- 9. \$5 in cash to help with the cleaning/sanitizing of the SARA House.

TOUR of the WHITE MOUNTAINS



COVID-19 INDOOR TRAINING SAFETY GUIDELINES (06/28/21) by Amy McPherson, amy.mcpherson@sarci.org This document presents the safety guidelines that shall be implemented for indoor training during the COVID-19 pandemic.

New loss of taste or smell

Nausea or vomiting

Before Class Health Screening:

If you have any of the following conditions please consider not attending the event:

Fever (Temperature of 100.4 or greater) plus cough and shortness of breath/ difficulty breathing _

- _ Chills
- Congestion or runny nose
- Diarrhea

Muscle pain _ Sore throat

During Class Precautions:

The following precautions will be used during time in the classroom:

- Maintain social distancing of 6 feet or more when possible.
- Masks shall be worn by those not fully vaccinated for COVID-19. Masks are optional for those fully vaccinated. _
- Reminders will be given to wash or sanitize hands.

Hands on Scenario Precautions:

- Masks and eye protection will be required. _
- Nitrile gloves will be used and changed in between patient contacts.

Classroom Hygiene:

- _ All equipment and indoor surfaces used will be cleaned and sanitized after/between use
- Tables, chairs, equipment will be sprayed down with disinfectant before/after training _
- All unneeded equipment and furniture will be kept separate and clean _
- _ Medical equipment will be disinfected between patient contacts
- Instructors will thoroughly wipe down and disinfect surfaces after class
- During indoor meetings or trainings air vent fans will be set to "On" throughout the building. _

Post-Training COVID-19 Exposure or Diagnosis

- Should a student develop symptoms or receive positive COVID-19 test results within 14 days after attending training, it is recommended that they notify the Medical Chairs (SARAMedicalChairs@sarci.org) and advise of their current symptoms and/or positive test.
- Should the Medical Chairs become aware of a student with symptoms/positive test, the Medical Chairs will work with that student and/or Records to determine what trainings or calls that person attended in the previous 14 days.
- The Medical Chairs will contact persons who attended the same trainings as a person reporting positive symptoms/test results in the past 14 days and advise that they may have been exposed to someone with COVID-19 and should contact their doctor should they develop symptoms or have any questions. Persons will be advised of what symptoms to watch out for (above) and to get a COVID-19 test if necessary. The identity of the person reporting positive symptoms/test results will be kept confidential and will not be shared with training attendees.
- Persons who develop symptoms and/or receive a positive test should follow current isolation recommendations, as directed by ADHS. They will be permitted to attend trainings/calls once the recommended isolation period and time since last symptoms have been satisfied.

Southern Arizona Rescue Association Orange Card Requirements and Instructions 06/17/2021

The purpose of the SARA Candidate Training Card ("Orange Card") is to provide Candidates with field experience and training that will prepare them to lead a team of rescuers into the field. The Orange Card places a greater emphasis on field experience through callouts, rather than formal trainings, but Candidates will also need to be engaged in monthly trainings **Expiration Date.** The Candidate has until the end of the third (3rd) calendar year from the date of issue to complete all requirements of the Orange Card. If there are extenuating circumstances, the Candidate may appeal to the Board of Directors for an extension.

Advanced Medical Certification. The Candidate must complete an approved advanced medical certification before they can be awarded Rescuer status. Note: The certification will include the SARA Supplemental Medical Training Card "Blue Card" sign-off for Candidates with an advanced medical certification from outside of SARA.

Callouts. A minimum of 25 callouts (including "rendezvous only" calls) with a minimum total of 50 field hours are required to complete the Orange Card.

Trainings/Activities. The following describe the specific activities that are required for each of the Orange Card training/activities sign-offs.

- <u>Technical Systems</u>. Completion of a training that is focused on technical systems or personal rope skills. The two trainings required should focus on different skill sets.
- <u>Other</u>. Completion of any SARA training topic not specified as a required training on the Orange Card. In addition, trainings offered by other SARCI groups may be included with prior approval. The Candidate may receive a sign-off for participation as medical support at ONE non-SARA event, such as a bike race.
- <u>Leadership/Risk Assessment</u>. Completion of a monthly training specifically on the topic of leadership and risk assessment related to SAR operations.
- Land Navigation/Orienteering. Completion of a monthly training on land navigation skills.
- <u>Helicopter Ingress/Egress</u>. Completion of a helicopter training with DPS, including completion of ingress and egress at a hover.
- <u>**Trail Orientation.**</u> One trail orientation must be specific to Tanque Verde Falls (including identifying all the anchors at this location) and another must include significant off-trail travel. Other trail orientations may be provided during a callout if and only if holler points, LZs, radio relays, and other useful information about the trail is given to the Candidate. Trail orientations should take place during the day so these notable spots along the trail are apparent.
- <u>**Truck/Equipment/Stokes.</u>** Successful completion of a training based on the location and use of gear within all SARA trucks, to include an inspection of medical and technical bags.</u>
- <u>OPS Support</u>. Participation in the Operations function on a mission. To be signed off by the Operations Leader.
- **WEMR/WFA Patient.** Acting as a patient in either of the SARA-provided medical classes.

Ongoing evaluations. Any concerns that arise about a Candidate should be brought to the attention of a Member Advocate to be addressed appropriately. If the Advocates have received multiple concerns about a Candidate, they will address those directly with the Candidate and that Candidate's mentor every 4-6 months in order to help the Candidate be successful in achieving Rescuer status. A Candidate at any time may request that the Advocates review the Candidate's current status, specifically to evaluate "soft skills" such as leadership and teamwork that play a part in the decision to elevate a Candidate to the position of Rescuer.


Orange Card completion. On completion of the Orange Card, the Candidate will submit the card to the Member Advocates (*SaraAdvocates@sarci.org*) who will request a report from Records on the Candidate's certifications and activity and solicit feedback from field-active members on the performance of the Candidate and summarize this information for the Board of Directors. Cards should be submitted by the 1st Thursday of the month in order to be considered at that same month's Board meeting. Member Advocates will evaluate overall merits of the Candidate, based on these records and feedback from members before submitting an Orange Card to the Board. Review of these merits

could include an interview with the Candidate. The Advocates may choose to make a recommendation that the Candidate is ready to be given Rescuer status. If their recommendation is negative, the Advocates will inform the Candidate before submission to the Board, and the Candidate can choose whether or not to proceed with the submission at this time. Note: The Candidate will be permitted to speak to the Board in their own defense and be allowed to address any questions or concerns that may come up prior to an *in camera* session where the Board will make their final decision.

Re-evaluation. If a Candidate's completed Orange Card is brought before the Board, and the Board decides that the individual is not yet ready to be given Rescuer status, they will be given a re-evaluation period to improve before they may present their case for Rescuer again. When the initial decision is made for this re-evaluation period, the Candidate must be given a list of improvements that the Board needs to see. The feedback given to the Candidate will be clear, actionable, and will include a date as to when the Board wants to see progress on the provided feedback. During the re-evaluation period, the Candidate should be given a mentor, appointed by the Board, to help them achieve success.

Extenuating Circumstances. Individuals who cannot meet the Orange Card time limits because of circumstances that keep them from engaging in trainings or callouts for an extended period of time may appeal to the Board of Directors for special consideration. These circumstances may include, but are not limited to, deployment, pregnancy, illness, injury, or work-related activities.

SARA MEDICAL TRAINING

Below is the medical training currently being offered by the SARA Medical Committee. These trainings are open to members of all SARCI component groups. Where space is available, Caver SMEs are welcome. Members can register for the sessions by following the links provided or by emailing me directly. The sessions will be offered at the SARA House so long as current CDC, county, city, and SARA policies are able to be followed. We understand the situation is ever changing due to the COVID-19 pandemic and we will do our best to communicate cancellations or changes in the format in which the courses will be offered (limited class sizes, outdoors, online, etc). We want to do our best to make the most responsible decisions.

Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR): The Provider certification. Participants are required to ^{04/20} bring their own ventilation barrier device (mask or shield). The course is \$5.00 to cover the AHA fee for issuing your CPR card. This will be payable to the instructor via cash or check made out to "Southern Arizona Rescue Association".

No CPR classes are currently scheduled

Wilderness First Aid (WFA): The following session is scheduled. There are no fees or required materials for this course. Weekday sessions will be held from 18:30 - 22:00 and Weekend sessions from 08:00 - 17:00.

Blood Borne Pathogens (BBP): It is an AZ state requirement that all search and rescue volunteers take an OSHA BBP class once per year. Completion of the Bloodborne Pathogens class and its associated quiz constitute an annual recertification requirement for all SARCI component groups. The SARA Medical Training and Standards Committee is pleased to currently offer two options for fulfilling this requirement:

- 1. A live online class presented by our own George Simons on Teams, followed by an online quiz, occurring 3-4 times a year, with the next class likely occurring this spring; or
- 2. NEW A self-paced online presentation, also narrated by George, at the end of which the viewer is presented with a link to complete the online quiz. This self-paced presentation is available anytime 24/7 to SARCI members at the link below:

Simply click to advance through the slides; the narration will play automatically. The presentation is about 40-45 minutes in length. You will need to log in to Microsoft 365 with your SARCI credentials to access the presentation and the quiz. I will collect quiz results and submit them to Records for you.

Finally, there are several online classes offered by third parties that may be acceptable for fulfilling the requirement. Please check with the MTSC and Records in advance to verify that a given external class is satisfactory for this requirement.

Naloxone Administration: Due to the nation-wide opioid crisis, the State of Arizona recommends all first responders be trained in the administration of Naloxone. SARA offers this optional training to all SARCI members free of charge. To remain current it is recommended rescuers re-take this training once every two years.

ASHI Training

SARA has been approved to be an ASHI Training Center. We are fishing up the details now, and will soon be able to issue Basic First Aid and Advanced First Aid cards from ASHI. These new certs will be an optional supplement to those who need a certification card for SARTech and other qualifications. We are looking at using these classes for PR events in the future.
