# 2023 BOARD OF DIRECTORS ELECTIONS (PART 1)

It's that time of year again to present the slate for the Board for 2023. See below for details and those that will guide us through this task this year.

#### **Nomination Committee Members:** Manny, Christine, Granny

Tasked with filling a slate of nominees for the April annual vote to fill the Board slots that will become open. Five Board slots will be open this year to fill. A slate of at least enough to fill the Board slots will be presented at the February meeting. Nominations from the floor are accepted at the February and March meetings.

#### **References:**

**By Laws: Article II, Section 4**: Only Field Qualified Voting Members shall be entitled to vote on each matter submitted to a vote of the membership.

By Laws: Article IV, Section 2: The number of Directors shall be nine. Each Director shall hold office until the second annual meeting of members following their election, and until his/her successor shall have been elected and qualified. Directors must be residents of the State of Arizona and must be, or must have been at one time, Field Qualified Voting Members of the corporation. Each Director may hold office for a maximum of two consecutive two-year terms. A minimum break of two years is required after serving four consecutive years in office as a Director.

**By Laws: Article IV, Section 3**: ... Nominees for election shall be proposed by a Nominating Committee, selected by the Board of Directors, in accordance with Article VI, Section 7 of these By-Laws, and presented to the membership at the February meeting. Additional nominees may be proposed from the floor at the February and March meetings of the members with the consent of their nominees.

**ByLaws: Article VI, Section 7**: Nominating Committee. A special Nominating Committee of three or more Voting Members shall be selected by the Board of Directors at their December meeting. The Nominating Committee shall present a slate of nominees sufficient to fill the open Board seats at or before the February meeting of members. Nominations from the floor are accepted at the February and March meetings of members.

# Why serve on the board?

SARA Board members play a crucial role in running the organization and making decisions that affect all members and the community we serve. They guide important efforts like training, recruiting new members, approving candidate promotions, communicating with the community, and managing our finances. Our officers (President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer) and many other key roles are filled by board members.

#### How long is the commitment?

Board members serve a two-year term with the option to run for a second consecutive term. (After four years, a two-year break is required before serving again.) Board meetings are held monthly on the third Thursday at 7pm.

## 24 HOURS IN THE OLD PUEBLO

SARA will be providing medical support for the 24 Hours in the Old Pueblo (24HOP) mountain bike race. The race dates are February 17-19, 2023. We will need the largest number of people (~25 in total) from 08:00 Sat February 18 to about 15:00 Sun February 19. In addition, 5-6 people will be needed Wed February 16 from 16:00-18:00 to load the truck; at least six people will be needed Thursday, February 17 from 13:00-18:00 to erect the tent at the venue; and 3-5 people will be needed for medical support Friday, February 18 from 12:00 -18:00.

To participate in medical support on Friday-Sunday you must be fully field qualified (technical and medical, i.e., WEMR as a minimum). Qualified candidates are welcome. To help load the truck and set up the tent, you need only be a SARA member, or a friend of SARA.

We will have a shift plan in place for this event. You do not need to work the entire span of the event, which officially runs from 12:00 Saturday until 12:00 Sunday. The shift plan is highly variable depending on your availability. A minimum of 4 hours, excluding transit time, is the recommended minimum shift duration.

Upon completion of this multi-day course, you will be eligible to take the National Registry written and psychomotor exams to obtain your NR-EMR certification, a requirement for advancement to "orange shirt," and will also satisfy the wilderness medicine requirement of our organization.

The course will run from Tuesday, January 17 to Saturday, March 25. Classes will be every Tuesday and Thursday evening from 18:00 – 22:00 with four Saturday classes from 08:00-17:00 on Feb 11, Feb 25, March 18, and March 25.

#### ACCORDING TO HISTORY – THE FIRST SEARCH

(The following is a reprint of the third in a series of twelve short articles that first appeared in SARNews from November 1994 (Vol 19, No. 11) through October 1995 (Vol 20, No. 10).

Few Tucsonans, willing to go into the field for "The First Search", were equipped for the wet snow and low temperatures they encountered. There had been an unprecedented, heavy snowstorm in Southern Arizona which left three Boy Scout hikers stranded in the Santa Rita Mountains in late November, 1958. We did the best we could.

Typically, we used shoe polish to waterproof our boots. We added flannel pajamas, for long underwear, to our blue jeans and Levi jackets. When wet boots got taken off for the night, they froze and became very hard to put back on in the morning.

We had no way to travel over the snow, but could only 'post hole' and take turns breaking trail. Even weeks later, on the trail, we were stepping in somebody else's post holes. There were no gasoline or propane stoves to be carried into the field to provide hot food or beverage. The stranded hikers had no better equipment.


Military units were sent into the field, lightly equipped. When nothing was found on their first day out, they were ordered to stay overnight and were re-supplied from the air. It was sort of training for them -- snow survival for downed pilots and support for cut-off combat units. More than one of the air drops missed its mark. The result was some cold soldiers that night, and new sleeping bags for civilian hikers next spring, as they scrambled all over the mountain looking for them.

Watch this space for my accounts of communications and base camp operations.

#### **About the Author**

While attending high school in Tucson, in Pima County, Arizona, Marvin Stafford got his start in Search and Rescue as a member of a Boy Scout Explorer Post which called itself a 'Search and Rescue Post'. They practiced first aid, mountaineering, and some simple technical evacuation procedures. They did not get much business as there was not a mechanism in place for volunteers to assist the Sheriff's Department with their responsibility. When a major search incident occurred, involving three fellow Boy Scouts, in November, 1958, the post played a significant role. Marvin joined the Southern Arizona Rescue Association, as soon as he was old enough, in 1960. While an undergraduate engineering student at the University of Arizona, Marvin's summer job was with the Forest Service doing fire control work in the mountains near Tucson. There, he did SAR work in a Forest Service uniform; a qualified volunteer team was not yet a reality. #### INDOOR TRAINING SAFETY GUIDELINES (2022/01/14)

This document presents the safety guidelines that shall be implemented for indoor training during the COVID-19 pandemic.

## **Before Class Health Screening:**

If you have any of the following conditions please consider not attending the event:

- Fever (Temperature of 100.4 or greater) plus cough and shortness of breath/ difficulty breathing

- Chills – New loss of taste or smell

Congestion or runny nose
 Diarrhea

Muscle pain
 Nausea or vomiting

- Sore throat – Fatigue

## **During Class Precautions:**

The following precautions will be used during time in the classroom:

- Maintain social distancing of 6 feet or more when possible
- Genuine N95 or KN95 masks shall be worn
- Reminders will be given to wash or sanitize hands

## Mask Care:

- Replace when soiled, wet, or damaged
- When not in use, store/dry in paper bag

## **Hands on Scenario Precautions:**

- Masks and eye protection will be required
- Nitrile gloves will be used and changed in between patient contacts

## **Classroom Hygiene:**

- All equipment and indoor surfaces used will be cleaned and sanitized after/between use
- Tables, chairs, equipment will be sprayed down with disinfectant before/after training
- All unneeded equipment and furniture will be kept separate and clean
- Medical equipment will be disinfected between patient contacts
- Instructors will thoroughly wipe down and disinfect surfaces after class
- During indoor meetings or trainings air vent fans will be set to "On" throughout the building.

# Post-Training COVID-19 Exposure or Diagnosis

- Should a student develop symptoms or receive positive COVID-19 test results within 14 days after attending training, it is recommended that they notify the Medical Chairs (<u>SARAMedicalChairs@sarci.org</u>) and advise of their current symptoms and/or positive test.
- Should the Medical Chairs become aware of a student with symptoms/positive test, the Medical Chairs will work with that student and/or Records to determine what trainings or calls that person attended in the previous 14 days.
- The Medical Chairs will contact persons who attended the same trainings as a person reporting positive symptoms/test results in the past 14 days and advise that they may have been exposed to someone with COVID-19 and should contact their doctor should they develop symptoms or have any questions. Persons will be advised of what symptoms to watch out for (above) and to get a COVID-19 test if necessary. The identity of the person reporting positive symptoms/test results will be kept confidential and will not be shared with training attendees.
- Persons who develop symptoms and/or receive a positive test should follow current isolation recommendations, as directed by ADHS. They will be permitted to attend trainings/calls once the recommended isolation period and time since last symptoms have been satisfied.

This form is provided by the Sheriff's department and should be completed on all medical calls. I would encourage its use on other calls, such as searches, to document the condition of our victim even if uninjured and in no distress. One can find fault with any first care form. I'm sure some of you can find things to improve on this one, but take a deep breath and just go with what we have.

The good thing about this form is that it is easy to fill out. The headings are self-explanatory (I have always been told to never say that, but I think it is true here.). Become familiar with the form. You do not have to carry one and fill it out at the scene. You can take notes and fill the form out after the call. They are kept in all of the trucks.

Keep in mind your chart is a snapshot of the encounter and serial exams/vital signs. It is impossible to document every second of the time spent with the patient short of taking a video of the entire time we are with them.

Important things to document (other than everything, of course) include a brief history of the current problem, past medical history, current medications, and allergies. I avoid open ended questions here. I ask about specific conditions. Do you have heart problems, diabetes, lung problems? Do you take a blood thinner? Etc., etc. Then a primary survey, the form has a nice outline of what needs attention. The secondary survey part of the form is also a good outline of what to address. It works best if one person does the exam and reexams of the patient, and a separate person acts as scribe. The second person can also hand dressings, etc. to the person who actually has hands on the patient. This makes sure someone with uncontaminated hands is digging in the med kit.

In the face of a complicated trauma patient, take a deep breath and take your own pulse. Don't worry about missing a small laceration here and there, or that sprained finger. The "can't miss" items include vital signs (repeat at appropriate intervals depending on situation) and continuous monitoring of the primary survey headings (A, B, C, D, E).

When you turn the patient over to another provider, higher level of care, ambulance, helicopter crew, etc., it is VERY, VERY important that you note the time of the handoff, and a brief note about the patient's condition at that time. For example, If the patient shows up at the hospital and is noted to be unable to move their legs, everyone is going to want to know when that happened and fingers will be pointed at all the caregivers. If your note shows the patient was neurologically intact and moving all extremities at the time of handoff, you are protected.

There are places on the back of the first page of the form for obtaining consent for treatment and refusal. Verbal with a witness is okay if the circumstances to not allow for signatures, or if you do not have the form in hand. Refusals can be tricky. The person with the highest medical certification should be involved in this, and law enforcement may need to step in. For example, we can't leave an intoxicated person with an open leg fracture in the bottom of Tanque Verde Canyon, no matter how adamantly they refuse or threaten us. The standard of care is what would a reasonable person do in the same circumstances. Remember, you or one of the deputies can always confer with medical control (and should in these cases). You will get in trouble for not taking care of someone. You will not get in trouble for taking care of someone.

Completed forms may be given to a truck driver, or you can slide it under the locked door of the medical storeroom. Remember this is part of the patient's medical record and must be protected.

Survey1 Ranger1

18:10 – 20:30 A hiker became disoriented near the saddle at the top of the Finger Rock Trail and wound up off trail to the east. She was not equipped to spend the night, didn't have any light source, and her phone was dead. Several teams started in while the weather was looking like it was going to deteriorate. Ranger 1 responded from Phoenix and inserted a medic who worked his way over wet rock on a sideslope to access the hiker, then escorted her back to the insertion point, and flew her to the SARA House.

Thu Jan 05 14/ 70/ 58yf ankle injury

Sutherland Trail, Catalinas

Ranger1

19:40 – 22:25 A hiker injured her ankle high on the Trico Powerline Road portion of the Sutherland Trail. She continued until calling for help. Teams rode and hiked towards the hiker, and Ranger1 responded from Phoenix. The helo delivered her to the LZ in Catalina State Park. (the Hasty Team arrived in time to watch the hoist)

Thu Jan 12 3/ 20/ SRDI Missing Person from Vehicle

Redington

12:30 – 14:45 A missing person (from Ohio?) was tied to an abandoned vehicle stuck in sand at Redington. SRDI was asked to look around the area to see if there was any evidence of the subject being in the area. Nothing was found.

Fri Jan 13 14/43/62ym hiker off trail

Finger Rock Canyon, Catalinas

17:10-18:55 A group of three were hiking back from Kimball. One was well in front of the others, and dropped into the canyon at The Corner and started downstream until he could not find a way through the boulders and called for help. As teams headed up trail, the hiker was able to extricate himself and retrace his steps up to the trail. He met teams near The Overlook, and all hiked out.

Sun Jan 15 19/ 74/ Hikers stranded by high water

x3 Bear Canyon, Catalinas

20:00 - 21:55 Hikers returning from 7 Falls became stranded when the stream became too deep. Teams hiked up the social trail from the north end of Bowes Road and down to the subjects. All returned by the same route without problems.

Mon Jan 16 25/166/37ym 29ym backpackers overdue

Sabino Basin, Catalinas Rangerl

09:15 – 13:35 Two hikers were backpacking from Prison Camp to West Fork Sabino Canyon. When they returned, stream crossings were challenging and they were stopped as they approached Pine Creek Crossing. They were reported overdue when they did not arrive at their ride at the Visitors Center. Teams headed in to look for them, from Prison Camp, Palisades, and Box Camp Trails. Bear Canyon was not crossable at Sycamore Reservoir and teams coming down from high trailheads were dealing with snow-covered trails. Snow and rain continued through the morning, then began to clear as Ranger1 arrived to help. They located the subjects, dropped some gear at SARA House, then retrieved the hikers.


