ACCORDING TO HISTORY – THE ONE-WHEELED STOKES

(The following is a reprint of the fifth in a series of twelve short articles that first appeared in SARNews from November 1994 (Vol 19, No. 11) through October 1995 (Vol 20, No. 10).

In the early 60's, the cadre of the Southern Arizona Rescue Association (SARA) was made up of individuals from the construction industry. They had access to tools and shops and materials, both new and used. Thus, when SARA needed a better way to travel over narrow, steep trails with a loaded Stokes basket litter, these were the individuals who fabricated the first frame that attached a motorcycle wheel to the middle of the underside of the basket. They added handles to the front and back and experimented with shoulder straps.


The first successful model was taken to a national meeting of the Mountain Rescue Association (MRA). The attenders got some hands-on experience as they wheeled each other up and down hills and between trees. They liked it. Each team went home, and, with their own resources of talent and material, came up with their own version of the One-Wheeled-Stokes. By now, all MRA teams are using what started right here in Pima County.

The original is a museum piece. It may be viewed at the Pima Air Museum as part of the Helicopter Air Rescue Display. Watch this space for a review of SARA motor vehicles.

About the Author

While attending high school in Tucson, in Pima County, Arizona, Marvin Stafford got his start in Search and Rescue as a member of a Boy Scout Explorer Post which called itself a 'Search and Rescue Post'. They practiced first aid, mountaineering, and some simple technical evacuation procedures. They did not get much business as there was not a mechanism in place for volunteers to assist the Sheriff's Department with their responsibility. When a major search incident occurred, involving three fellow Boy Scouts, in November, 1958, the post played a significant role. Marvin joined the Southern Arizona Rescue Association, as soon as he was old enough, in 1960. While an undergraduate engineering student at the University of Arizona, Marvin's summer job was with the Forest Service doing fire control work in the mountains near Tucson. There, he did SAR work in a Forest Service uniform; a qualified volunteer team was not yet a reality. Marvin has served on the SARA Board of Directors and has been the Chairman for the Arizona Region of MRA.
