2023 WHISKEY OFF-ROAD RECAP

SARA treated 30 riders at this year's Whiskey Off-Road mountain bike race in Prescott. The number of riders treated was down a bit, but still seemed hectic at times. Despite the unusually warm weather, only a few riders sought treatment for heat-related problems. As usual abrasions were prominent among the injuries. No riders were transported by ambulance. One rider was transferred to Lifeline Ambulance but refused transport. Several riders with deep lacerations were referred to Yavapai Regional Medical Center (YRMC) for cleaning and suturing. Nine members were involved in SARA's support of the 2023 Whiskey Off-Road.

SWIFTWATER TRAINING

Swift Water training is scheduled for early June, again hosted by Chief Brian Frost of the Rural-Metro Fire Department and in coordination with the Pima County Sheriff's Department. Please register using the RSVP form link provided at the bottom of this email. If you have never completed this training before, you are required to attend both days to obtain a state certification. If you have completed this training before, attending one of the days will satisfy recertification. Space is limited in this training with only 18 slots open for those seeking certification and an additional 10 slots each day for those only requiring recertification.

Preference will be given in the following order:

- 1. Those who were unable to complete the course in 2021 and/or 2022.
- 2. Field active Orange shirts who have never had this training before.
- 3. Field active Yellow shirts who have never had this training before.

The training will take place at the following times, dates, and locations (click location links for Google Maps):

<u>DAY 1</u>

Saturday 10 June 2023 09:00 – 17:00 (exact time TBD)

Tucson Estates Community Center and Pool

This day will be comprised of a classroom and swimming pool session. The classroom session will go over various aspects of swift water awareness and rescue. The pool session will have skills such as water entry techniques, subject retrieval, throw bag practice, and a physical fitness swim test. The test will require you to tread water for approximately 10 minutes and swim approximately 300 yards without a PFD and 300 yards with a PFD using combinations of sidestroke, breaststroke, and freestyle. Swim techniques will be taught prior to the test but some practice and conditioning are recommended before the course date. Please wear your SARA uniform for the classroom portion and bring a swimsuit for the pool. PFDs and throw bags will be provided but you are able to bring your own approved gear.

<u>DAY 2</u>

Sunday 11 June 2023 08:00 – 17:00 (exact time TBD)

Phon D Sutton Recreation Site

This day will be at a natural running water source, where we will practice the techniques learned on Day 1. The majority of the day will be spent in the water. Even though the air temperature is hot the water can be very cold so a wetsuit is recommended but not required. Water shoes, boots, or old tennis shoes and a helmet are required. You will also want to bring water, food, and appropriate clothing/sunscreen so that you are prepared to be outside all day. Carpooling to the site is highly encouraged.

<u>IMPORTANT</u>: due to winter precipitation, the Salt River Project released high water volume earlier this year that resulted in some site closures; there is the possibility this may occur again during the summer, which would similarly result in site closures and require a possible reschedule; we will keep everyone updated should that occur.

More details will be provided by Chief Frost and SARA Training as the training date approaches. *Swift Water Training 2023 RSVP Form* - please submit a response no later than 01 June.

CAVE TRAINING GUIDELINES

Protecting caves and yourselves at the upcoming SARA cave training - June 2023

Peppersauce Cave is a highly impacted cave with relatively high annual visitation. However, we want to make sure our training does not hurt the cave or anything living in it. Caves have very delicate ecosystems that can be upset by litter/trash/crumbs/human waste/lint/skin/hair/etc. There is no reason to damage a cave on a training at any time.

Cave Conservation Plan:

If any activity during the training is deemed to be negatively impacting cave resources (e.g., bats are present and agitated), the training will be stopped or temporarily halted and we will debrief outside or complete the drill outside the cave. Participants will be asked to snack outside the cave, or over their packs to prevent crumbs from being left behind in the cave. Only water will be allowed in the cave. All waste materials (trash, human waste), will be carried out. Anchors for belays will be adequately padded to prevent any damage to rocks or trees. If we encounter snakes in the cave entrance, if it is possible to relocate them safely nearby we will do so. If it is not possible, we will complete the training elsewhere, avoiding the snakes.

Because of the threat of White-Nose Syndrome to Arizona bats, no equipment that has been in any other cave or mine since 2005 will be allowed in the cave UNLESS it has been completely decontaminated according to the US Fish and Wildlife Service protocols updated 09/2018. See <u>https://whitenosesyndrome.org/</u> for more information.

What to bring:

- 1. Helmet (with chinstrap, UIAA/CE approved)
- 2. Three sources of light, at least two helmet-mountable
- 3. Spare batteries for your lights
- 4. Gloves (gardening/nitrile palms (\$2 at Walmart or Ace) good for cave)
- 5. Water (enough for the day)
- 6. Snacks/lunch (nothing that is too crumbly bring snacks in a Ziploc to collect crumbs while you eat)
- 7. Garbage bag/space blanket
- 8. Jacket if we stop and rest during the training (it can be chilly)
- 9. Personal first aid kit/bandana/meds/whatever you need throughout the day
- 10. Kneepads (highly recommended), elbow pads (optional) get at sporting goods store
- 11. 20ft of 1" tubular webbing
- 12. Small pack (<20L), streamlined with no extra straps or anything that can catch
- 13. Pee bottle, though we'll probably be able to exit the cave in this particular case
- 14. Camera (optional)
- 15. Change of clothes and shoes for the car

What not to bring:

- 1. Large packs with lots of straps
- 2. Carbide lamps
- 3. Anything that leaves behind crumbs or trash

What to wear:

- 1. Jeans/Carharrts/work pants or hiking pants (cave may be wet)
- 2. T-shirts probably fine for underground
- 3. Hiking boots or approach shoes (whatever you're comfortable in)



ACCORDING TO HISTORY-SARA'S FIRST EQUIPMENT VEHICLE by Marvin Stafford, marvin.stafford@sarci.org

(The following is a reprint of the sixth in a series of twelve short articles that first appeared in SARNews from November 1994 (Vol 19, No. 11) through October 1995 (Vol 20, No. 10).

By my figuring, the Southern Arizona Rescue Association (SARA) is 36 years old, this month. (Others say older.) In the early 60's, the cadre was made up of individuals from the construction industry. Their solution to securing and transporting organization-owned equipment was a small, enclosed trailer -- the type you would expect at a construction site for the contractor's tools.

The trailer was parked at one driver's house. He and two other drivers had pick-up trucks with compatible hitches and electrical connections. When a call would come down, the three would try to contact each other by phone and decide who was going to take the trailer to base camp. Without direct communication, a driver would have to drive by the house just to make sure he was not the first one. *[Arizona just did <u>WHAT</u> in the first round?!!]**

The trailer, painted yellow, was outfitted with a roof rack for the Stokes basket, a removable shelf alongside for clip boards, maps and a coffee pot, sockets at the corners for flood light poles and a small engine-generator mounted on the hitch. The standard routine was to start the engine as soon as the trailer arrived at base camp -- then the flood lights and coffee pot. After that, people could be signed in and given assignments. Sometimes searchers would wait for a cup of coffee before going into the field.

It is hard to turn down a piece of equipment when you are getting it for, 'our favorite price', but this engine had a lousy muffler and a bad rod knock. The Board of Directors finally got rid of it by voting down a request for money to rebuild it. *[Who do we cheer for, now?]**

Watch this space for an account of 'growing pains'.

* -- Bracketed remarks refer to the University of Arizona Men's Basketball Team and the beginning of the NCAA Tournament in 1995, which was getting started during this writing.

About the Author

While attending high school in Tucson, in Pima County, Arizona, **Marvin Stafford** got his start in Search and Rescue as a member of a Boy Scout Explorer Post which called itself a 'Search and Rescue Post'. They practiced first aid, mountaineering, and some simple technical evacuation procedures. They did not get much business as there was not a mechanism in place for volunteers to assist the Sheriff's Department with their responsibility. When a major search incident occurred, involving three fellow Boy Scouts, in November, 1958, the post played a significant role. Marvin joined the Southern Arizona Rescue Association, as soon as he was old enough, in 1960. While an undergraduate engineering student at the University of Arizona, Marvin's summer job was with the Forest Service doing fire control work in the mountains near Tucson. There, he did SAR work in a Forest Service uniform; a qualified volunteer team was not yet a reality. Marvin has served on the SARA Board of Directors and has been the Chairman for the Arizona Region of MRA.
