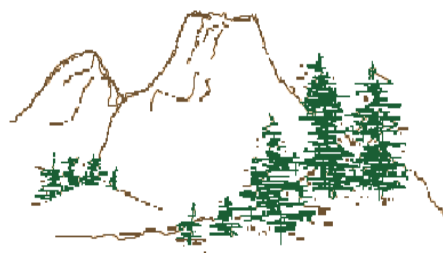

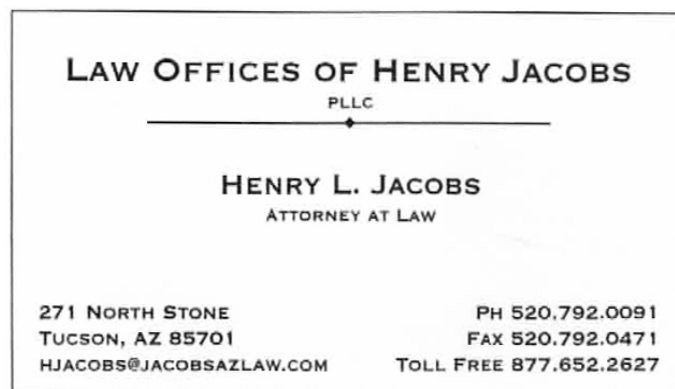

(The following is a reprint of the seventh in a series of twelve short articles that first appeared in SARNews from November 1994 (Vol 19, No. 11) through October 1995 (Vol 20, No. 10).

A Tracking Aid for MRA Members

There was a time that almost all quality hiking boots had a common 'Vibram Sole' lug pattern. This allowed the Mountain Rescue Association (MRA) to recommend a method, for marking the boot soles of all its members, so that the tracks of the trackers could be separated from others.

The old standard lug pattern had a single cross in the middle of the heel. If you carefully cut off the two lateral arms of the cross and left only a long, narrow lug, oriented with the length of the boot, you would have the MRA Pattern. It is always surprising how visibly distinctive the tracks become.

I have put this distinctive marking to good use when family members have gotten separated during non-SARA hikes. (For a time, my family member-hiking companion was an MRA Member.) I have used it to follow my own route back, but I do not recall an actual case where its intended use was applied by trackers.

I can remember stopping at a trail junction while, on a non-SARA hike, and making a purposeful heel print next to the sign post. The idea was that if I should get into trouble and a SARA tracking team had to come looking for me, they would pause at the junction and look around. Upon seeing my mark, they would KNOW it was mine and which direction I had taken. This type of assistance has never been required. When they did have to come after my party, they KNEW where we were.

Watch this space for an account of 'growing pains'. (--or do you want to hear about the time I was a 'Rescuee'?)

About the Author

While attending high school in Tucson, in Pima County, Arizona, **Marvin Stafford** got his start in Search and Rescue as a member of a Boy Scout Explorer Post which called itself a 'Search and Rescue Post'. They practiced first aid, mountaineering, and some simple technical evacuation procedures. They did not get much business as there was not a mechanism in place for volunteers to assist the Sheriff's Department with their responsibility. When a major search incident occurred, involving three fellow Boy Scouts, in November, 1958, the post played a significant role. Marvin joined the Southern Arizona Rescue Association, as soon as he was old enough, in 1960. While an undergraduate engineering student at the University of Arizona, Marvin's summer job was with the Forest Service doing fire control work in the mountains near Tucson. There, he did SAR work in a Forest Service uniform; a qualified volunteer team was not yet a reality. Marvin has served on the SARA Board of Directors and has been the Chairman for the Arizona Region of MRA.

Sun June 04 14/ 78/ Evidence Search Windy Corner, Redington Pass, Catalinas MaricopaSO
 07:30 – 09:05 A semi truck got stuck on a switchback above Tanque Verde Trails, and the driver had been missing for over a week. MaricopaSO wanted to look around the area, so SRDI teams covered slopes to the north and we flew a couple of drones over the area.

Tue June 06 8/ 8/ ??y? fall injury “The Bridge”, Finger Rock Canyon, Catalinas
No field times A person was calling for help from “The Bridge” in Finger Rock Canyon. We were cancelled shortly. The last streets off Alvernon go through gates, and the one to the right is Playa de Coronado. There is a change to the pavement as you drive/walk over The Bridge, otherwise you might not notice. There is another one over Pontatoc Wash just before driving up the hill. Now you know!

Wed June 07 17/ 42/ 46yf runner ankle injury x8 Bear Canyon Trail, Catalinas Ranger2
 16:05 – 17:30 A runner above 7 Falls injured her ankle and was continuing slowly but it was getting late. Ranger2 hoisted her.

Sat June 10 6/ 18/ 25ym hiker exhausted Pusch Peak Trail, Catalinas Ranger2 GRFD FWFD
 14:25 – 15:55 A hiker high on the Pusch Peak Trail was exhausted. Ranger2 ferried him to one of the ball fields.

Sat June 10 7/ 29/ 16yf fall injury Bear Canyon Trail, Catalinas Ranger2 RMFD
 14:35 – 17:10 While the previous call was working, a female hiker appears to have injured her head in a fall near x7, but went up trail towards the falls. Teams rounded her up for Ranger2, and walked her dog to the trailhead.

Sat June 10 11/ 83/ 15ym runner missing Pusch Ridge, Catalinas Ranger2 Survey1
 18:00 – 22:35 Before previous calls completed, a trail runner was overdue in the foothills between Bighorn and Table Mtn. Family looked for him during the afternoon. Teams went in from Alamo Canyon and from residential roads overlooking the search area. Winds had been high during the afternoon, but quieted as the sun set and the runner could be heard responding to shouting. Survey was spotted our teams, who provided a compass bearing towards the runner. Survey spotted the runner’s dog and then him, and provided coordinates. The location was on top of the broad ridge, so Ranger2 dropped off a Rescue Specialist (Raterink). Meanwhile a team reached the runner, who was fine. Ranger ferried runner, dog, a couple of rescuers, and packs to OPS, and remaining teams hiked out.

Sat June 10 12/ 34/ 77ym missing Tanque Verde Ranch Survey1
 18:05 – 20:00 As the previous call began, a subject was reported missing in Tanque Verde Ranch. Survey1 spotted a person face-down on a nearby trail, and we assisted retrieving him.

Mon June 12 23/ 191/ 21ym hiker fall injury Thimble Ridge, Catalinas Ranger2 Survey1 Mavic3
 23:25 – 08:15 A hiker near 7 Falls noticed it was getting late, and thought his map showed a quicker route over Thimble Ridge to the tram road in Sabino. He sustained serious injuries in a fall high on the ridge, and his cellphone had parted ways during the fall. He was behind a very large flake of rock that had separated from the main cliff, so he had a very narrow view down canyon. Hikers on trails below heard him hollering. It took a long time for teams to work out the echos and arrive on scene. After it got light, the patient was lowered to a spot in the open and Ranger2 flew him direct to hospital.

Fri June 16 15/ 48/ ??ym ??yf hikers lost Marshall Gulch, Catalinas
 18:25 – 19:15 Two hikers lost below the Gaging Stn were talked back upstream and retrieved by Cody as teams arrived in the area.

Sat June 17 9/ 113/ 20yf 50yf hikers lost Marshall Gulch, Catalinas
 22:00 – 07:30 Two other hikers were lost further down Sabino and it took the rest of the night to retrieve them.

Sat June 24 19/ 97/ 20yf 22ym hikers lost Romero Canyon, Catalinas M30T GRFD CSP
 14:20 – 17:20 Hikers looking for the trail wound up lost downstream and were retrieved via the ridge from Saddle3.

Sun June 25 12/ 38/ 2 hikers exhausted Wilderness Fork, Catalinas Ranger2 MLFD
 19:30 – 20:25 Hikers in Wilderness Fork of Sabino (a.k.a. House Rock Canyon) were exhausted and retrieved by Ranger2.

Tue June 27 6/ 28/ 24ym hiker exhausted Pusch Peak, Catalinas RMFD
 09:35 – 13:25 A hiker from Chicago became ill while returning from Pusch Peak. Refreshments were delivered and all hiked out.
