BOARD OF DIRECTORS

FROM THE BOARD

As a reminder, these are the standing items that the board is discussing based on the feedback we got from our survey.

- Rework Mentor Program (Increased Retention)
- Increased Member Survey Frequency (Increased Retention/Mission Participation)
- Board Effectiveness (Mission Participation/Increased Retention/Quality Training)
- Include new members in activities and taking a leadership role (Increased Retention/Quality Training)

The mentor program re-structure has been the primary focus because the new SALT class is upon us. Topics on this list will serve as an ongoing agenda item in board meetings.

BOARD TERM LIMIT

We will soon be voting on whether to remove the two-term limit for board members, by removing the wording in red of the ByLaws section:

Article IV, Section 2: Number, Tenure and Qualifications of Office. The number of Directors shall be nine. Each Director shall hold office until the second annual meeting of members following their election, and until his/her successor shall have been elected and qualified. Directors must be residents of the State of Arizona and must be, or must have been at one time, Field Qualified Voting Members of the corporation. Each Director may hold office for a maximum of two consecutive two-year terms. A minimum break of two years is required after serving four consecutive years in office as a Director.

CLUTCH TASKBOOK

The board voted to approve the Clutch Taskbook Supplement (attached on Page 7) as part of the migration strategy away from the MPD to the Clutch. This is a new, simpler piece of hardware that the technician team has been working with. The goal is to have completely migrated from MPD to Clutch in July 2024. Please contact JustinP, RichardH, or SarahT with questions.

This is a required Orange Card sign-off, and is only offered once per year.

The Wednesday classroom session will focus on map and compass skills and usage of the CalTopo GPS / mapping app in the context of a mission, especially a search. Please bring a quality compass and a charged cell phone.

The field exercise will apply the skills taught in the classroom and will involve navigating a course in the field. The Saturday field exercise will meet at 07:00 at 106; please bring your rescue pack.

TECHNICAL SKILLS: AWARENESS-LEVEL TASKBOOK

We have slightly simplified the Awareness-level Taskbook in advance of SALT. What we have changed as of now:

- Removal of all "redundant" anchors. The only three anchors on the Awareness sheet now are the W3P2 (Wrap-3,Pull-2), Double Loop (Wrap-2,Pull-2), and the Tensionless Anchor (in rope).
- Rewording of some items to make signoffs clearer and more efficient.
- Adding rope tailing skills.
- Changing wording to include "Descent Control Device" so that as people do the Clutch Supplement, they can also fill out their Awareness taskbook (if you're working on a new one).

Many folks don't like the "memorization" (Static System Safety Factor) but I would like to remind everyone that knowing especially the strengths of our soft goods is really important so we don't overload our systems. Long-term that signoff will look different than having to name a million numbers, but due to the tight timeline before SALT and our desire to be thoughtful in what we ask every FQ person to know, we haven't changed that yet.

This new taskbook is on the SARA Documents page online. If you are currently working on a taskbook you are welcome to transfer those signoffs to the new Awareness taskbook, but please keep your original one and submit both until we have everyone on the new taskbook.

TECHNICAL SKILLS: CLUTCH TASK BOOK SUPPLEMENT by Richard Hounshell, richard.hounshell@sarci.org

The Board has approved a Clutch Task Book Supplement that will be used to bridge the gap between the retirement of the MPD and implementation of the Clutch. The supplement can be completed without needing to complete a new task book. As with our existent task book, you can complete the supplement as either Awareness, Operations, or Technician as appropriate for your current level (or lower if desired). It is important to note that to remain field qualified, all members must complete this Clutch task book supplement by July 1, 2024. If you complete a Clutch supplement at a lower level than your current task book, on 7/1/2024 you will revert to that lower level of task book. Signoffs for the supplement will be available at all applicable technical trainings just as they are with MPD signoffs. We hope that you will work towards completing this expeditiously, so that we can begin the transition away from the MPD as soon as possible.

ACCORDING TO HISTORY

(The following is a reprint of the ninth in a series of twelve short articles that first appeared in SARNews from November 1994 (Vol 19, No. 11) through October 1995 (Vol 20, No. 10).

SARA's Involvement in the MRA

The Southern Arizona Rescue Association (SARA) has been a member of the Mountain Rescue Association (MRA) almost from its inception. The MRA was founded at the Timberline Lodge, near Mount Hood, Oregon, in 1958. It is a national association of separate teams that do volunteer mountain rescue work, each in their own area. 1958 was the year of 'The First Search' in Southern Arizona.1

The first member teams were from Washington, Oregon and Northern California. They established qualifications for membership and recruited additional member teams. In order to qualify, SARA, as a young team, had to recruit some additional people with the required hiking and climbing skills. As the story goes, at least two of those needed new members had indicated their intentions to join SARA but had not done so. When the time came to submit the roster to the MRA, they were out of state, hiking in the Sierra Nevada. When they got back to Tucson, they were surprised to learn they were members of both SARA and the MRA.

During the past 30 years, SARA has provided the National Chairman once, Ray Neal, hosted the fall business meeting four or five times and hosted the three-day summer conference twice. At this summer's conference in Vail, Colorado, SARA's delegates have instructions to get us 'penciled in' to be the host again in 1999 which will be 10 years after our very successful meeting in 1989.

- The class starts at 0730 sharp each day so students should arrive by 0715.


