FROM SPACE

The OSIRIS-REx mission came to an end on Sunday, the 24th of September with a successful touchdown of the sample return capsule in the Utah desert. The regolith from asteroid Bennu will be sent to research labs around the world but most will be kept in storage for future generations to study. Massive congratulations to Anjani Polit for playing a major role in this mission. Watching the landing on Sunday morning with my family was a lot of fun.

The OSIRIS-Rex mission ended with the release of the sample capsule. The spacecraft has fired its engines to divert past Earth on a new mission to the asteroid Apophis, and is now called OSIRIS-APEX (APophis EXplorer). Anjani will be continuing with the new mission. (but she won't be changing her name)

To access the 2023 OEC Refresher Cycle A Online Modules, follow the steps below to register and complete:

- Click on Center for Learning at the top of your screen
- Click on the Yellow Browse Catalog Button
- Click on Featured Learning
- Enroll in the Online Modules
- Navigate to the Blue Learning Center button to launch the course

To register for the 2023 OEC Refresher Cycle A Skills Session, follow the steps below:

- Log into <u>nsp.org</u> and use your username and password
- Click on Center for Learning at the top of your screen
- Click on the Yellow Browse Catalog Button
- For the Oct. 21st Session Type in **Mt Lemmon** in the Search Catalog field and click the Search button. Scroll down and the Mt Lemmon Skills Session should be listed. Click the Enroll Button for that session.
- For the Oct. 22nd Session Type in **Southern Arizona** in the Search Catalog field and click the Search button. Scroll down and the Southern Arizona Rescue Council, Inc. Skills Session. Click the Enroll Button for that session.

Again, you can register for either date.

NSP has changed the required completion of the online refresher before signing up for the Skills Refresher; however I recommend that you go ahead and complete it prior to the Skills Refresher.

Registration for the Oct 21^{st} and 22^{nd} Skills Sessions are currently open. Please register as soon as you can as registration closes on Oct 18^{th} for both sessions.

Be sure to bring your current OEC and CPR cards as well as your stethoscope, BP cuff and any snacks and drinks you may need.

Awareness signoffs are available before every monthly meeting, but no field signoffs for Operations-level are available Operations field signoffs are available at every "personal rope skills" session at the Craycroft / Rillito Bridge.

Anyone is allowed to come to any Technician training, even if the sign-off focus is mostly on keeping technicians current. We also will have opportunities for anyone to try some more advanced skills, even if you haven't submitted an application to the technicians yet.



TECHNICAL SKILLS: AWARENESS-LEVEL TASKBOOK

We have slightly simplified the Awareness-level Taskbook in advance of SALT. What we have changed as of now:

- Removal of all "redundant" anchors. The only three anchors on the Awareness sheet now are the W3P2 (Wrap-3,Pull-2), Double Loop (Wrap-2,Pull-2), and the Tensionless Anchor (in rope).
- Rewording of some items to make signoffs clearer and more efficient.
- Adding rope tailing skills.
- Changing wording to include "Descent Control Device" so that as people do the Clutch Supplement, they can also fill out their Awareness taskbook (if you're working on a new one).

Many folks don't like the "memorization" (Static System Safety Factor) but I would like to remind everyone that knowing especially the strengths of our soft goods is really important so we don't overload our systems. Long-term that signoff will look different than having to name a million numbers, but due to the tight timeline before SALT and our desire to be thoughtful in what we ask every Field Qualified person to know, we haven't changed that yet.

This new taskbook is on the SARA Documents page online. If you are currently working on a taskbook you are welcome to transfer those signoffs to the new Awareness taskbook, but please keep your original one and submit both until we have everyone on the new taskbook.

TECHNICAL SKILLS: CLUTCH TASK BOOK SUPPLEMENT by Richard Hounshell, richard.hounshell@sarci.org

The Board has approved a Clutch Task Book Supplement that will be used to bridge the gap between the retirement of the MPD and implementation of the Clutch. The supplement can be completed without needing to complete a new task book. As with our existent task book, you can complete the supplement as either Awareness, Operations, or Technician as appropriate for your current level (or lower if desired). It is important to note that to remain Field Qualified, all members must complete this Clutch task book supplement by July 1, 2024. If you complete a Clutch supplement at a lower level than your current task book, on 7/1/2024 you will revert to that lower level of task book. Signoffs for the supplement will be available at all applicable technical trainings just as they are with MPD signoffs. We hope that you will work towards completing this expeditiously, so that we can begin the transition away from the MPD as soon as possible.

ACCORDING TO HISTORY

(The following is a reprint of the tenth in a series of twelve short articles that first appeared in SARNews from November 1994 (Vol 19, No. 11) through October 1995 (Vol 20, No. 10).

The Several Names Within Volunteer Search and Rescue

We are all familiar with the names of the separate volunteer organizations that make up the Search and Rescue Council, Inc., at the present time. Over the years, there have been lots of other names that have come and gone.

In the '60's, the work was shared by Civil Defense, Emergency Services and a loosely organized Sheriff's Mounted Posse. There was a motorcycle club that put people into the field on trail bikes called Tote-Goats. Later, the local four-wheel-drive club with their CB Radios and association with the National Jeep Patrol, put in a lot of man/equipment hours on 4WD mountain roads and mountain snow conditions. For a time, the Civil Air Patrol had a ground contingency that participated in searches, especially when they extended into multiple days.

SARA has had mutual training and back-up relationships with teams from adjacent counties as well as the Arizona Mountaineering Club - Rescue Team, out of Phoenix, who were themselves a fully accredited MRA team until the late '80's. There have been education and business relationships with organizations such as the American Red Cross, the National Ski Patrol, Southern Arizona Hiking Club and Hug A Tree. We have worked with paid professional teams ranging from local ambulance crews and fire departments to the state Department of Public Safety and the national level of the Forest Service, the Park Service, the Border Patrol and the Air Force.

The list goes on. I left out the League of Mountain Wayfarers. It takes a lot of people, resources and organization to carry this 'volunteer' search and rescue work. We are not alone.

No field times Two drones were used to document an area of interest in Cienega Creek for PCSD detectives. It would have been challenging terrain and vegetation for foot teams.
