BOARD OF DIRECTORS

We appreciate that more people are attending board meetings and learning about the process and how decisions are made. I've seen the Teams attendees roster list grow through 2023 and I am glad more of you are curious enough about what is happening to spend those (sometimes) late Thursday nights with us.

Drones In The Field

When drones are going to be deployed in the field, Operations will make sure this is communicated to the field teams by radio and by including mission data in ERM. The pilot(s) will also be in close contact with Operations and their Visual Observer(s), in case field teams have any needs, and in the event that a helicopter will be nearby as the drone(s) will need to be grounded immediately. SWARM appreciates all the feedback.

Policy Changes

Several policy changes were presented to the membership for feedback over the last several months, and, having completed that process, the Board voted to approve the policy amendments as presented. They were:

1. Clarification of the pathway to Candidate and Rescuer for individuals who join SARA with pre-existing and/or higher medical credentials, with detailed requirements contained in a new **SARA Medical Training Requirements Supplement** controlled by the Medical Training and Standards Committee and Medical Director.
2. Addition of a definition of what constitutes a *wilderness* continuing medical education credit - i.e. wilderness medicine defined.
3. A policy detailing the pathway for a Basic Member (green shirt) to become a Candidate (yellow shirt).

The policy changes are reflected in a revised SARA Policies document that is posted on the [SARA Documents Web page](#).

We have also requested that teams entering events in the calendar clarify who is eligible to participate. This has been a confusion point for many newer members over the years.

BOD ELECTIONS

SARA Board of Directors elections will be held in April, 2024. In odd-numbered years, five directors are elected, and in even-numbered years, four directors are elected. This year, FOUR positions are open. Elected directors serve a 2-year term and are eligible to serve a second 2-year term if re-elected, after which they must take a minimum break of two years.

Any SARA member who is, or has been, a field-qualified Voting Member (Rescuer, Orange Shirt) and is an Arizona resident is eligible to run, provided they are not currently at term limit. The current candidates are:

If you are interested in serving on the Board or would like to nominate a candidate, with their consent, final nominations from the floor will be accepted at the March meeting (March 1).

MARCH MONTHLY TRAINING

The March monthly training will be an **area search exercise** in the vicinity of the General Hitchcock campground. The training will be held on Saturday, March 02 beginning with a briefing at the SARA House at 06:00. This exercise will provide an opportunity for ground personnel to practice participating in an area search and searching a segment for a lost subject and relevant clues, and for the SARA IMT Planning Section to prepare for and manage an area search operation for one operational period. The IMT Planning Section will operate out of the SARA House as the Incident Command Post (ICP), with the Hitchcock parking lot used as a staging area for ground teams.

Rendezvous: During a multiday search operation, an operational period will typically run from 06:00-18:00. **There will be a briefing at 06:00 at the SARA House** (at the start of Operational Period 1 under our scenario) where teams will receive their search assignments, then deploy to Hitchcock, search their assigned segments, and then return to the SARA House to debrief.

Besides operational procedures involved in a ground search, it will be a chance for participants to familiarize themselves with some of the Incident Command System (ICS) forms used and some of the tools involved, such as CalTopo.

Ground personnel should bring their full rescue pack and be prepared to perform a grid search of their assigned segment, in potentially rough terrain.

24 Hours in the Old Pueblo – Recap

SARA provided medical support for the 24th edition of the 24 Hours in the Old Pueblo mountain bike race. This year, 82 patients were treated. Three riders were evacuated by ground ambulance. There were numerous shoulder/clavicle injuries, much road rash, and cactus in abundance. Twenty-one SARA members assisted with the medical mission at the event. The official timekeeper and results person also was a SARA member. On Sunday the Paramedic and EMT from American Medical Response were instrumental in managing two patients, who were transferred to Golder Ranch Fire Department for transport to the Emergency Department. COMMUNICATIONS

Use of Amateur Radio (ham) frequencies requires an FCC license to operate (transmit) and a requirement to identify using your FCC call sign. There have been many occurrences lately of failure to identify, including during callouts and “kerchunking” (keying up a radio without speaking) on the Lemmon repeater and Lemmon simplex frequencies (449.775 MHz). Use of tactical call signs (“Ops”, “Hasty”, “Team 1”) by themselves are not in accordance with FCC rules. You must identify using your call sign per FCC Part 97 rules:

§97.119 Station identification.

- (a) Each amateur station, except a space station or telecommand station, must transmit its assigned call sign on its transmitting channel at the end of each communication, and at least every 10 minutes during a communication, for the purpose of clearly making the source of the transmissions from the station known to those receiving the transmissions. No station may transmit unidentified communications or signals, or transmit as the station call sign, any call sign not authorized to the station.

Unlike the licenses for PimaSAR and StateSAR, ham frequencies are not allocated specifically to SARCI / SARA. Repeater frequency use is coordinated with an Arizona frequency coordination committee. Any ham operator can use our frequencies, not just SARCI/SARA members. Rest assured many are listening, and our behavior good or bad will most certainly impact our continued ability to use them.

Please remember to set a good example. Identify with your call sign when you transmit on ham radio frequencies whether on a call out, training, or you are testing your equipment. If you are on a call out and are using a tactical call sign you must include your FCC call sign (“Team 1, WD8KRV”, for example). FCC penalties for failure to adhere to Part 97 include loss of operating privileges and/or fines.

TECHNICAL SKILLS: AWARENESS-LEVEL TASKBOOK

We have slightly simplified the Awareness-level Taskbook in advance of SALT. What we have changed as of now:

- Removal of all “redundant” anchors. The only three anchors on the Awareness sheet now are the W3P2 (Wrap-3, Pull-2), Double Loop (Wrap-2, Pull-2), and the Tensionless Anchor (in rope).
- Rewording of some items to make signoffs clearer and more efficient.
- Adding rope tailing skills.
- Changing wording to include “Descent Control Device” so that as people do the Clutch Supplement, they can also fill out their Awareness taskbook (if you’re working on a new one).

Many folks don’t like the “memorization” (Static System Safety Factor) but I would like to remind everyone that knowing especially the strengths of our soft goods is really important so we don’t overload our systems. Long-term that signoff will look different than having to name a million numbers, but due to the tight timeline before SALT and our desire to be thoughtful in what we ask every Field Qualified person to know, we haven’t changed that yet.

This new taskbook is on the SARA Documents page online. If you are currently working on a taskbook you are welcome to transfer those signoffs to the new Awareness taskbook, but please keep your original one and submit both.

The Clutch Supplement is due on 7/1/2024 or you will lose FQ status. Your overall rope skills taskbook will revert to whatever level Clutch supplement you’ve completed on 7/1/2024.

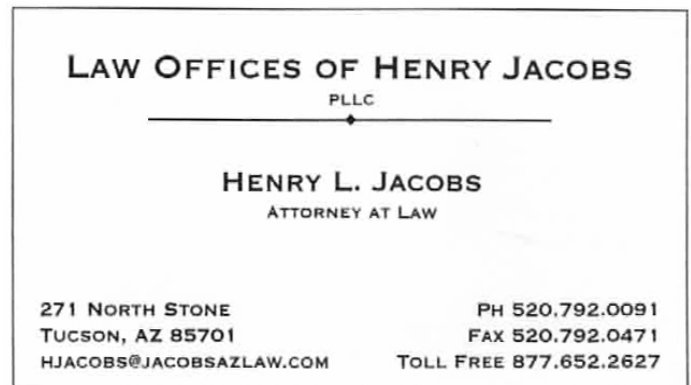

TECHNICAL SKILLS: CLUTCH TASK BOOK SUPPLEMENT by Richard Hounshell, richard.hounshell@sarci.org

The Board has approved a Clutch Task Book Supplement that will be used to bridge the gap between the retirement of the MPD and implementation of the Clutch. The supplement can be completed without needing to complete a new task book. As with our existent task book, you can complete the supplement as either Awareness, Operations, or Technician as appropriate for your current level (or lower if desired). It is important to note that to remain Field Qualified, all members must complete this Clutch task book supplement by July 1, 2024. If you complete a Clutch supplement at a lower level than your current task book, on 7/1/2024 you will revert to that lower level of task book. Signoffs for the supplement will be available at all applicable technical trainings just as they are with MPD signoffs. We hope that you will work towards completing this expeditiously, so that we can begin the transition away from the MPD as soon as possible.
