SARA supported the Cactus Classic Trail Run / Walk on the Bowen Trail in Starr Pass on August 28.



These are the new tech bags.

They are duplicates of each other and any 2 bags contain our previous tech bag plus 1 pulley and 1 piece of edge pro. The Clutch is now primary for our systems and each bag weighs significantly less than our previous bags. These bags can be split between two rescuers in the same team but both will be needed to produce our current system. Something to remember when grabbing gear.





TECHNICAL SKILLS: UPDATED TASK BOOKS

Changes have been made to the Task Books to simplify and tighten-up training and operations:

- Update to the Safety Analysis Section
- Removal of the Operations Task Book Level
- Removal of the Webbing Stokes Tie-in replaced with the FERNO Basket Patient Harness
- Addition of three "new" knots: Bowline, Alpine Butterfly and Clove Hitch
- Change to the Bowline rope anchor instead of the Tensionless
- Addition of 3 optional task books items
- Only Technician Committee Members can complete signoffs

This new task book is on the SARA Documents page online. If you are currently working on a task book you are welcome to transfer those signoffs that are identical to the new Awareness task book, but please keep your original one and submit both. In addition, task books can now be completed digitally via ERM and will be live by 9/1/2024.

TECHNICAL SKILLS: UPDATED MANUALS

Changes have been made to the SALT/Awareness and Technician Manuals to align with the update to the CLUTCH and Task Books. These new manuals are on the SARA Documents page online. There are significant updates that should be reviewed individually including but not limited to:

- The replacement of the webbing Stokes tie-in with the FERNO Basket Patient Harness
- Removal of the MPD operations replaced with CLUTCH operations
- The addition of three "new" knots (bowline, butterfly, and clove hitch)
- The addition of Edge and Rappelling operations
- Updates to the gear inventories
- Significant changes to the Technician Manual for over-the-edge operations

Each manual also has updated photo addendums to assist in understanding the new skills. Many of these skills can be self-taught (knots in particular), but can be learned or reviewed at any of the upcoming technical trainings.

TECHNICAL SKILLS: CALENDAR

All trainings are tentative until they appear on the Master Calendar and are announced via email.

All Level signoffs are available at all trainings; field signoffs are available at Personal Rope Skills, Field Trainings, Tower Trainings, and quarterly major Technician Trainings. No signoffs are available at Technician Team Meetings.

This year we are due for our MRA Technical recertification, so stay tuned for prep dates for that recertification.

Tech Taskbooks are included under "My Stuff" in ERM. If you prefer paper to be able to view it all in one place, those files can still be found on the SARA Documents page, but all taskbooks will now be managed through ERM.

The Clutch Supplement was due on 7/1/2024 or you lost FQ status. Your overall rope skills taskbook reverted to whatever level Clutch supplement you completed on 7/1/2024.
